About Future Talent

Founded in 2004 by The Duchess of Kent and Nicholas Robinson, we break down barriers, create opportunities and harness the power of music to transform the lives of young musicians across the UK.

With over 4.2 million children living in poverty in the UK and thousands of children with exceptional musical abilities failed by society every year, we want to achieve an equal reality where all gifted young musicians from low-income backgrounds flourish.

Our core is in the evolution of the young lives we affect; inspiring examples of musical talent and life development.

Our Programmes

Future Talent operates two programmes supporting gifted young musicians from low-income backgrounds across the UK. Our **Development Programme** typically supports musicians aged 13-17 years old, while our **Junior Programme** supports younger musicians at an earlier stage of their musical development.

Our programmes offer unique opportunities for young musicians to build confidence, develop personal skills, and enhance their musical experience.

Both programmes are run by our dedicated Relationship Team, on hand to provide guidance and support to our young musicians and their families throughout and beyond their time supported by Future Talent.

Development Opportunities

We ensure that every musician is offered a **one-to-one mentoring session** with a top professional musician, selected **based on the young musician's musical interests and aspirations**.

Our Programmes also provide a range of development opportunities led by inspirational expert musicians and educators, including world class **masterclasses**, creative **workshops** and **performance opportunities**.

Financial Support

Alongside these opportunities, we also provide our young musicians with **financial support**. Award amounts vary from £500 on the Junior Programme, to scholarships on the Development Programme up to £2,000, per year. Check out [Join](#) for more information on the different awards.

Our financial support applies to the primary instrument only. For instance, a young musician whose primary instrument is the violin may not use their financial support to fund piano lessons.

Awards can contribute towards **any musical costs relating to the musician's primary instrument**, including:

- **Lesson** costs
- **Ensemble & course** fees
- **Exam** and **audition** fees
- **Instrument costs** including purchase, hire, insurance, parts and repair
- Music **technology** and other **equipment**
- **Sheet music**

Eligibility

In order to be eligible for support, musicians must:

- Be **under 18 years of age** on 1 September 2022
- Have been **permanently resident in the UK** for minimum **3 years**

Applicants must also provide details of household income totalling **no more than £32,500 per annum** in order to be eligible for support.

The panel will consider applications where combined household income is over £32,500 per annum if there are **extenuating circumstances**. Please ensure any details of such circumstances are shared in the application.

Applications not providing evidence of household income will not be considered.

Application Requirements

Some elements of the application require prior preparation. Please ensure you have prepared the following before starting your application.

Tutor Reference & Information

Applications must include contact information and a written reference from the young musician's instrument tutor, music teacher or other musical mentor.

References must be submitted via **file upload**. Image file formats .pdf, .jpg and .png are preferable. Screenshots of email correspondence are acceptable.

Supporting Recordings

Applications must include **two (2) recordings of contrasting pieces**, performed by the applicant on their **primary instrument**.

Applicants' recordings are a key consideration in the shortlisting process. Applicants should carefully consider the acoustics of the recording location in order to maximise sound quality. Recordings are usually made using a smartphone, tablet or laptop/computer.

Recordings can be submitted via either:

- **File upload** (for file size up to 10MB)
- **A private YouTube link** (*We recommend this method as many audio-visual files will be too large to upload)

Please note:

- Applicants should submit **2 recordings**, totalling no more than **10 minutes**. Longer recordings may not be listened to in their entirety.
- Recordings can be **audio-visual or audio only** and **both are assessed equally**.
- Recordings can be **accompanied or unaccompanied**. Ensemble recordings will **not** be accepted.

Financial Information

Some sections require applicants to provide detailed information regarding parent/guardian(s) financial circumstances, as well as copies of relevant documentation to support the information given.

Financial documents must be submitted via **file upload**.

For each parent/guardian, applications **must** provide **EITHER**:

- a) 2021/22 P60 **AND** three recent monthly pay slips
- b) 2020/21 P60 **AND** three recent monthly pay slips
- c) 2020/21 SA Tax Return

Applicants must also provide evidence of any support claimed from Universal Credit, including Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit, Jobseeker's Allowance, Employment and Support Allowance.

Why do we need this information?

We ask for detailed records of each applicants' financial circumstances as due diligence to our supporting trusts, foundations and individuals whose funding exclusively supports young people from low-income backgrounds, to ensure our opportunities and financial support continues to be provided to those who need it most.

Important Information

Applicants should be aware of the following information before applying.

Saving Application Progress

The application form contains several sections and can take over 45 minutes to complete. Please make sure you have all the above requirements to hand when you begin your application.

Applicants can start the application form, close it, and return to it later without losing their answers. **Information will be kept safe in local browser storage for 14 days.** In order for information to save, applicants:

- **MUST** use **the same device** on which they started the application
- **MUST** use **the same internet browser** on which they started the application
- **MUST NOT** use **Incognito** or **Private browsing** mode

Applications not submitted within 14 days of being started will be permanently erased and therefore cannot be considered.

Application Submission

In order to submit an application, applicants must click '**Submit**' at the end of the application process. You will receive an email confirming submission within 24 hours.

Please note: Future Talent cannot view applications before they have been submitted.

Application Deadline

The deadline for all applications is 1 July 2022, at 1200 noon. Applications submitted after the deadline will not be considered.

Shortlisting will take place during **July 2022**. All candidates will be notified of results before **31 July 2022**. Successful candidates will be invited to audition. **Junior Programme** candidates are **not** required to audition.

Auditions will take place in London and Manchester in **September 2022** (dates TBC). Some auditions may also be held virtually. Other locations may be announced.
