CSS was founded in 1981 by a devoted group of parents, educators and community leaders. We were established on the premise that all individuals deserve an optimal chance to live with independence, self-esteem, and personal fulfillment. This fundamental belief continues today as we have grown to now serve individuals across more than 50 communities in west suburban Cook and eastern DuPage counties.

CSS offers comprehensive services that include: Respite, Residential & Independent Living, Supported Employment, CSS Academy Programs, Community360 Day Program, Counseling and Behavior Support, Home-Based Support Services, and Professional Certification Programs. Bilingual Services are available.



Who We Serve

CSS serves children, adults, and seniors diagnosed with intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD) which are characterized by significant limitations in intellectual functioning and adaptive behavior that occur before age 22. Some examples include autism, cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, and epilepsy.

Our Services

Respite Services provide an important break for loving parents and caregivers. CSS is Illinois' largest Respite provider. Respite services may be provided in the family's home or in the community; and can take place in one-on-one or group settings. This program helps develop self-esteem, independence, and social skills for the participant. Individuals enjoy outings in their community and new experiences with professional, supervised support. For parents, our services can reduce stress and improve home life by providing relief from caregiving. There are also regular Parents' Night Out groups that offer affordable care for younger children, and their siblings, at several community locations. Social Groups are available for adults with I/DD who enjoy community-based activities.

Independence

Residential & Independent Living services are designed to support adults living in the community, whether they live with their family, on their own, or in an agency group home. Our participants have different interests, goals, and living situations, so, the resources and supportive services we provide are tailored for each person. Options include 24 Hour CILA homes for people who need 24/7 support in a group home setting, and Intermittent CILA for people who live on their own, or with family, and need support but not constant supervision. CSS offers Counseling and Behavior Support to individuals enrolled in the program who would benefit from these clinical services.

Supported Employment services are designed for adults who are interested in working or volunteering in the community. The focus for participants is on achieving employment, and acquiring the skills to become productive and valuable employees. In partnership with the Chicago Zoological Society's Brookfield Zoo, our **Bridges On the Job Training Experience** develops employment skills through volunteering. Each participant is supported by a CSS Job Coach.

CSS Academy Programs build community through social and educational opportunities for people with and without disabilities. Classes and workshops are offered for people with I/DD, their families, caregivers, and other community members who want to learn





something new. Classes are taught in the areas of the arts, life skills, technology, and health and wellness. **Art360** is an art program for young adults that brings art, learning, creativity, and social inclusion full circle. It is held at CSS Academy (Brookfield) and the Chicago Zoological Society Brookfield Zoo's. **Team Up** is a community-based program in Oak Park for young adults with I/DD who have completed high school. Curriculum includes art, fitness, nutrition and meal planning, money management, dance, and yoga. As part of the program, participants are transported to an art studio for art class, and a fitness center for health and wellness.

Community360 Day Program offers a fresh approach to traditional day programming. Participants choose meaningful ways to spend their day. Some activities include: structured volunteer work; classes in art, music and dance; daily living skills like understanding money and cooking; health and wellness; group exercise; and support that helps develop job skills and job searching skills. Located at CSS' Family Support Center in Cicero, the program offers daily activities in the community. This intimate setting is perfect for individuals who benefit from smaller groups, with more individualized attention and/or those with specific behavioral needs. There are English and Spanish speaking staff members.

Home-Based Support Services CSS offers Self-Directed Assistance and Group Respite options for individuals enrolled in Home-Based Support Services through DHS' Children's and Adult Waivers.
