When Sandy moved into the Summit group home, her mother was fearful that her transition would not be an easy one.

Sandy is 49 years old and is diagnosed with Down syndrome. She has lived with her mother her entire life, but due to some growing challenging behaviors, CSS staff, her mom, and Sandy agreed that a group residence would give her the support she needed.

Happily, Sandy proved her mom wrong and transitioned into her new home better than anyone could have expected. Within a month, Sandy established a routine and goals to achieve



each day. She likes being independent and works each day to make her bed and do her own laundry. Although Sandy does not communicate verbally very well, she advocates for herself through written notes that she gives to the staff.

Prior to moving into the Summit house, Sandy liked to stay up all night and sleep until late afternoon because she did not have a schedule or a daily routine. But today, Sandy wakes up early and goes to CSS' day program. She loves the structured environment in which she gets to choose how to spend her day.

"Sometimes families worry that their children will not do well outside of their home environment, but we often find the opposite is true. Sandy is progressing quicker than ever imagined. Keeping a schedule and having things to keep her busy has helped her to flourish."

Now that Sandy is happy and thriving in her new home, her mom, Kathy, has more independence too. This summer she took a trip to Michigan by herself and even looked up relatives out of state, something she could not have done while caring for Sandy in her home.

CSS owns and operates eight group residential homes in the community.
