When we met Collin, he had lost his placement at another agency due to challenging behaviors. Collin is non-verbal, diagnosed with autism and has difficulties developing social relationships.

Since a quiet environment is important for Collin's success, CSS worked to place him in a Brookfield group residential home with just one other roommate. We also hired two male staff members who were gradually introduced to him so he would feel comfortable with his transition. The staff at the Brookfield Home is specially trained to provide support for individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities as well as CPR, First Aid, and Safety Training. So they are prepared to give Collin and his roommate the personalized care they need.
