# CITY OF THORP REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, MAY 8, 2023, AT 6:30 PM AT THORP CITY HALL

### 1. Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

Meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Mayor Wnek. In attendance were Alderpersons Abramczak, Einhorn, Korn, Lawcewicz and Rosemeyer. Also in attendance were DPW Leech, Chief of Police Schneider, Clerk-Treasurer Pogodzinski, and Thorp Courier reporter Ross Pattermann.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

#### 5.SEH project updates

Paulette Hedrington updated the council on the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project. Conformed contracts have been reviewed by all parties and a Notice to Proceed was sent to Staab Construction on May 1st. The first construction meeting is scheduled for June 13th. A Public Interest Waiver (for BABAA requirements) was submitted to USDA National Office in March and is still under review. An ITA/PERF has been approved by WDNR which will allow for a Clean Water Fund (CWF) application to cover additional costs, if the public interest waiver is not successful in a timely manner. The W. School & N. Church Street and Utility Project Jack and Bore under the railroad has been completed by Haas. Watermain installation has been completed from Birch Street to Railroad Street. Road reconstruction for schedule B has commenced. The loan closings for DNR Safe Drinking Water and DNR Clean Water Fund are scheduled for May 24, 2023.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

 The Consumer Confidence Report is required by the DNR for the City's drinking water. DPW Leech informed that there were no violations.

M/M/S (Abramczak, Korn) to approve Resolution 2023-05-01. Motion passed unanimously.

- Resolution 2023-05-02 "Resolution Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of up to \$295,417 Sewerage System Revenue Bonds, Series 2023, and Providing for Other Details and Covenants with Respect Thereto, and Approval of Related \$492,362 Financial Assistance Agreement.
   M/M/S (Lawcewicz, Rosemeyer) to approve Resolution 2023-05-02. Motion passed unanimously.
- 9. Resolution 2023-05-03 "Resolution Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of up to \$538,135 Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 2023, and Providing for Other Details and Covenants with Respect Thereto, and Approval of Related \$896,892 Financial Assistance Agreement.

  M/M/S (Korn, Einhorn) to approve Resolution 2023-05-03. Motion passed unanimously.
- 10. Resolution 2023-05-04 "Resolution Adjusting Fees Allowed for Construction or Addition to Dwellings Covered Under the Ordinance Adopting the Uniform Dwelling Code"
  Building Inspector Christensen requested the fee schedule change to be the same as other communities he serves. The fees would include new home construction and additions in those areas that require inspections. M/M/S (Rosemeyer, Lawcewicz) to approve Resolution 2023-05-04. Motion passed 5 0.
- 11. Resolution 2023-05-05 "Resolution Approving Pay Application #4 from Haas Sons, Inc. for 2022 Street and Utility Project on E. School and N. Church Street"
  M/MS (Abramczak, Korn) to approve Resolution 2023-05-05 which was for pay application #4 from Haas Sons, Inc for 2022 Street and Utility Project on E. School and N. Church Street. Motion passed 5 0.
- 12. Resolution 2023-05-06 "Resolution Approving Pay Application #1 from Staab Construction Corporation for Wastewater Treatment Plan Upgrades Project" M/M/S (Rosemeyer, Lawcewicz) to approve Resolution 2023-05-06 which was for pay application #1 from Staab Construction Corporation for the Wastewater Treatment Plan Upgrades Project in the amount of \$293,534.80. Motion passed 5 0.

  Park and Rec are recommending opening the municipal pool on June 5<sup>th</sup>. New wage recommendations were presented, and swimming lesson dates were set. New swings will be added to Northside Park and funded by the Dairy Days Committee. Pickle ball courts were proposed but more information was requested. The Park and Rec recommended stop funding the dog park since it is self-funded.
  M/M/S (Einhorn, Rosemeyer) motion to accept Park and Rec Board's recommendations. Motion passed 5 0.
- 14. <u>Discussion and possible action regarding sale of cycle proceeds to Police Equipment Reserve account M/M/S</u> (Rosemeyer, Lawcewicz) to apply the cycle proceeds to the Police Equipment Reserve account. Motion passed 5 0.
- 15. <u>Discussion and possible action to post and seek applicants for an Administrative Assistant</u>

  Breanne Krug resigned from the Deputy Clerk position and Clerk-Treasurer Pogodzinski requested permission to seek applicants for the Administrative Assistant position.

  M/M/S (Rosemeyer, Korn) motion to advertise for Administrative Assistant position. Motion passed 5 0.

  Alderperson Korn updated the council on electric vehicle charging stations. He originally felt the parking lot on E. Main Street and N. Washington Street would be an ideal location but after researching, he encountered problems with this area. Another site was the parking lot by the bowling alley but again, problems incurred. He

noted that a federal grant was available and will continue to investigate other sites. He also felt some grant process needs to be pursued to help the downtown and felt partnerships need to be made in the community.
