## Rule 129 N.

N. Disqualifications. Any deviation in the line of travel, going off course, will result in a disqualification. Refer to rules for each class for specific disqualifications. Also see Rule 102.

There should be a change to the current rule 129 N. The rule should be changed for clarification. In gymkhana classes it is about moving the horse and yourself thorough a pattern in a timed fashion. When you stop (loss of forward motion) you are no longer completing the required task of the sport and it should result in a disqualification. Also technically depending on interpretation the loss of forward motion would also be a deviation in the line of travel, because you had a line of travel in motion and then you stopped (deviating) from the original plan.

## For the above reasons the rule should be changed to say:

Any deviation in the line of travel, *loss of forward motion*, *or* going off course will result in a disqualification. Refer to rules for each class for specific disqualifications. Also *refer to* Rule 102.
