About SSEND professional learning events

In order to ensure the maximum coverage of the entire geographical area of Western Australia SSEND uses a range of delivery modes for its professional learning. These modes include:

- self-paced online modules
- facilitated packages for delivery by leaders in schools
- in-person workshops and presentations
- live remote delivery through live-streaming and web-conferencing.

SSEND is also innovating in the professional learning space through the development of the **Blended Model** of professional learning delivery. This model takes the best elements of in-person learning and scales the size and reach of these elements through broadcast technology. The intention of the blended model is to bring remote participants 'into the room' by establishing clear norms and practices to guide this new delivery mode in which in person and remote participants engage in learning together.

SSEND's evidence based professional learning opportunities aim to create welcoming school communities for students with disability and will empower educators to support all students to reach their maximum potential.
