

About the Department's EUEA Module

Effective Utilisation of Education Assistants (EUEA) is a three session professional learning experience that is aimed at all school education staff: education assistants, teachers and school leaders.

The module includes an accompanying workbook with activities, reflection tasks, discussion points and supplementary content such as handouts.

What is covered in the EUEA module?

Catering to all Western Australian school contexts, EUEA explores ways of upskilling education assistants, and preparing teachers to work effectively with education assistants. This module is based on comprehensive research and highlights practices that are demonstrated to improve the learning outcomes of students.

In this module, education assistants will learn explicit strategies to promote student independence, while teachers will learn how best to support education assistants in their support of students.

The sessions of this module are *Shared Understandings; Roles, Responsibilities and Relationships* and *Building Independence*.

Featuring Western Australian regional and metropolitan examples of best practice, this module is an excellent way to prepare education assistants and teachers to work effectively together to support all students.

How can I undertake the EUEA module?

The module can be undertaken in varying ways, such as independently online or being presented by a facilitator in a group environment, with supplied facilitator notes.

The School of Special Educational Needs Disability (SEND) presents the module through a range of delivery modes, including live online and in-person.
