In order to ensure the maximum coverage of the entire geographical area of Western Australia SSEND uses a range of delivery modes for its professional learning. These modes include:

- self-paced online modules
- facilitated packages for delivery by leaders in schools
- The Blended Model

The Blended Model is a mode of professional learning in which online and in-person participants learn together in a live forum. A professional produced live stream and event-specific communication protocols ensure equity of access for all audiences.
