Answers: Most of the lines are correct or partly correct. The only line that is clearly wrong is C-8. Although the Gospels took place before the church began, all four were written during the church age and used in John, but these are not really parables. Line B-6 is a bit tricky, because there are various metaphores used in John, but these are not really parables.
