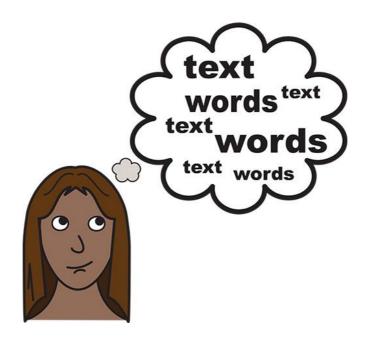

 - a walking frame



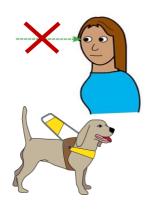
- it is hard to talk. You many need:

• it is hard to think in a clear way.

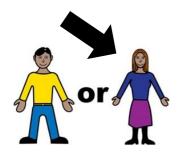
Discrimination

It is because of something about you.

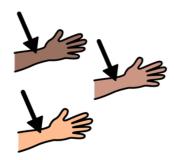
Like:

The **United Nations** is an organisation for all the countries in the world.

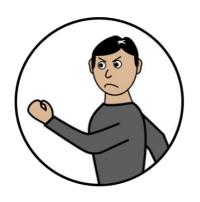
We will write **UN** when we talk about it.

Violence

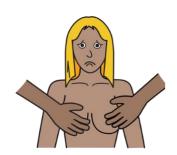
There are many types of violence.

- calls you bad words

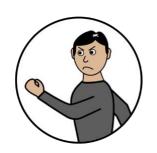


breaks your things



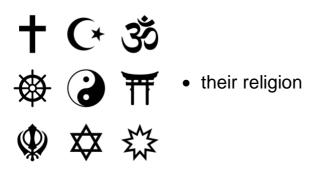


• does **not** let you go out.
