Chapter Highlights

...The secret of harmonious living is the development of spiritual consciousness. In that consciousness, fear and anxiety disappear, and life becomes meaningful with fulfillment as its keynote.

...To every such insistent demand, let our answer be: "No, no. This is not what I need or want. Thy grace is my sufficiency, nothing else—not money, not marbles, only *Thy* grace." Let us learn to hold to that resolutely.

Pp 1

...All of a sudden, we are given the necessary ability, which we discover is not our ability at all; it is His ability being expressed through us.

Pp 2

...Gradually, as over and over again the temptation comes to say, "I need; I want; I haven't enough; I am insufficient"; we remember that our sufficiency is in the Infinite Invisible.

Pp 3

...As consciousness becomes more spiritual, confidence in the Infinite Invisible increases, and our love, hate, or fear of the external diminishes. ... Every issue of life is determined, not by external conditions and things, but by our consciousness.

Pp 4

... The whole secret lies in the word "consciousness."

... God is; there is a God—never doubt that.

Pp 5

...Spiritual consciousness is attained through the activity of truth in consciousness. Dwelling on scriptural quotations or statements of truth helps to spiritualize thought. The more truth that we read and hear, the more active is truth in our consciousness. Thus we learn to abide in the Word. This is the first step on the Way.

...The second, and more important step, is to be able to receive truth from within, to be receptive and responsive to the truth that wells up within us.

Pp 6

...God's presence fills all space; the Spirit of God dwells in us. But how many people have felt that Presence? It is talked about, prayed about, theorized about, and sermonized about; but It is not experienced. It is the conscious awareness, the actual feeling or realization of the Presence which is necessary.

Pp 8

... There must be a conscious activity of truth going on all the time.

Pp 9

...As we go forward in our quest or search, we can measure our progress in this way: We see the horizon before us and we have the feeling, "Oh, I have just a short distance to go." Sometimes, it takes only a few weeks or months to reach that

horizon, and the whole world of Spirit is spread out before us. Then we believe we really have entered the kingdom of heaven, and we have—for a few days. Suddenly, we become accustomed to this light and we are aware of another horizon that urges us forward, another advance that must be traveled step by step, and again, we press forward.

Pp 9-10

... The further we go in this work, the more necessary it is that we know every one of these principles. They are the foundation of our understanding and they must become so much a part of us that when we are faced with a problem, we do not have to think consciously of any of them.

Pp 10

... Take scriptural passages which embody spiritual principles and live with them. Hold them up as a banner in the presence of any and every form of discord, until such time as these principles become automatic. This is dwelling in the secret place of the most High, living, moving, and having our being continuously in the consciousness of God, not just for a few minutes while reading a book or listening to a lecture. Despite the demands which are made upon us by the world, we must pause at frequent intervals during the day and during the night for the practice of the Presence.

Pp 12

...Take certain of these specific principles which you will find stated in this book and live by them. Take them one by one. Carry one of them with you day in and day out for a week or a month. Then take another and live with it, using it as a yardstick with which to measure every experience. ... Then we shall be abiding in the Word and shall bear fruit richly.

Inasmuch as the human thought is continuously being reminded of something in the external that it needs, or requires, or desires, there must be the specific answer, "No. No, it isn't that that I need or want. Thy grace is my sufficiency. Nothing else; not money or marbles. Thy grace is my sufficiency," and learn resolutely to stick to that.

which is quick and sharp and more powerful than a two-edged sword: that word of God which separates the Red Sea when necessary, which produces the cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night—the miracles in our experience—this meditation is a revelation of the Infinite Invisible declaring Itself within our own being.

... The real beginning is made when we can accept the revelation that the kingdom of God is within us...

influence of the Infinite Invisible which formed us and gives us dominion through grace. As humans we are under the law: legal laws, economic laws, health laws, food laws, climate laws. Bit by bit, demonstration by demonstration, principle by principle, realization by realization, we ultimately rise to come out from under the law into living by grace, which Paul described as: 'I live, yet not I; Christ liveth my life."
