## SUPER-FORTS FIRE SIX OF JAPAN'S 11 DOOMED CITIES

SIX OF THE 11 doomed Japanese cities have been fire-bombed and are burning, 24 hours after the "flee or perish" warning leaflets were dropped on them by Super-Fortresses.

From a moonlit sky this morning between 550 and 600 Super-Fortresses dropped more than 3,500 tons of bombs on the luckless cities and the Shimotsu oil refinery, 40 miles south-west of Osaka.

Pin-points of flame spread into great fires, which merged in their turn and sped through the cities, shrouding them with smoke rising to 18,000 feet.

Four cities - Ichinomiya, Ujiyama, Tsu, Ogaki - near Nagoya, are on Honshu, the main Japanese home island. Aomori, on the northern tip of Honshu and Uwajima, one of the largest towns on Shikoku Island, were the other fire-bomb targets.

Shimotsu oil refinery was hit by high explosive bombs. For the first time Iwojima was used as a stage by Super Fortresses, increasing their range by 1,500 miles and enabling them to drop bombs on Northern Honshu.

More than 60 Super Fortresses which raided Aomori made a trip of 3,800 miles. They carried a full load of 10-ton bombs.

At Iwojima each plane had its own gas pump and ground crew. Bombers landed and took off from a new 9,800ft runway.

As the Super Fortresses were flying to their targets they heard Marianas radio telling the Japanese that they were coming.

Although forewarned, the Japanese were not forearmed. Flak was meagre over the cities except Ogaki, where the Japanese fighters were also waiting. All the planes returned safely.

Before this morning's raids, 46 Japanese cities had been attacked with incendiaries, and 150 square miles, or more than 41 per cent. of the built-up areas of these cities had been burnt out.

## FLEET DESTRUCTION

Meanwhile Adml. Halsey is still pulling the Japanese dragon's teeth and claws. Since July 10 British and American carrier aircraft under his command have wrecked or damaged 945 Japanese 'planes, sunk or damaged 58 warships, 173 merchantmen, and 509 luggers, junks and other small craft. Twelve warships and 62 cargo ships were sunk.

Preliminary estimates show 122,500 tons of Japanese shipping have been sunk in the period, and 518,000 tons damaged.

The tightening of the Allied blockade and the accelerating of the air war make a ship damaged a ship lost to Japan. Many ships damaged by Adml. Halsey's 'planes cannot be repaired fast enough to take part in the final phase of the war.

British and American pilots returning from the strikes at Kobe and Kure on the Inland Sea reported that the battle-ships Haruna and Ise and the cruisers Tone, Aoba and Oyaoda were burning yesterday, and further damage was also inflicted on the escort carrier Kaiyo.

The battleship Hyuga, heavily damaged last Tuesday, is now resting on the bottom.

## Battleship Ripped Apart

Gen. MacArthur's communiqué stated that the 29,000-ton Japanese battleship Haruna was hit amidships by four 2,000lb bombs dropped by Far Eastern Air Force Liberators at the naval base of Kure on Saturday. The Haruna was ripped apart amidships and was blazing furiously after these direct hits.

## Kure Again Hit

Japanese broadcasts said that the Allied fleets are still cruising somewhere off Honshu, the main home island, refuelling and taking on fresh supplies for renewed blows against Japan. It added that 20 Super-Fortresses and 30 Liberators escorted by fighters attacked Kure again.

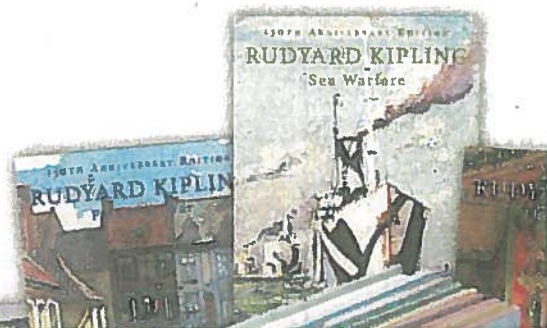
