




2021 Performance Plan

- Continue 5-yr management plan
 - SURVEY during spring and summer to determine presence of invasive species & effect of treatment on native species
 - **TREAT** invasive species
 - MONITOR/PERFORM water quality studies
 - MANAGE the CLID







Yellow iris is a **regulated invasive species**. Species are legal to buy, sell, transport and possess, but may not be introduced into a free-living state, such as released into public waters.


- Yellow iris grows along shorelines, in shallow water and in roadside ditches.
- Competes with native shoreland vegetation.

Zebra Mussel and Spiny Water Fleas Monitoring Program

- Zebra Mussel (veliger) and Spiny Water Fleas Testing
 - **■** Funded by Morrison County
 - Samples collected east of the lake access
 - June & July 2018, 2019, 2020: Negative for both
 - June & July 2021: Pending

Water Quality Monitoring Program

- Analysis performed by RMB Laboratory
- Monthly samples May-Sep from two sites
- Analysis includes: Total Phosphorus, Chlorophyll-a, and Secchi depth
- Lake Classification: Mesotrophic
- RMB labs ... Lakes Program ... Database



LID Management Protocols

Annual Levy

The annual levy will now be set by the Board. Factors we consider while we set the levy for 2022 are:

- Next years treatment area of Curly Leaf Pond Weed
- Next years treatment area of Eurasian Water Milfoil
- Likelihood that we can use the alternative herbicide to treat CLP
- Likelihood of receiving another AIS grant
- A recommended cash balance of about 1.5 times the yearly operating expenses
- Consideration of public input and comments


Election of Board of Directors
