George Tkabladze creates abstract stone, wood and mixed media sculptures to embed particular themes and ideas, focusing on illuminating problems and stereotypes of modern-day society. He received Bachelor of Fine Arts and Master of Fine Arts in sculpture from Tbilisi State Academy of Art (Tbilisi, Georgia). Two consecutive artist' residency grants at Studio Midwest (Galesburg, IL, USA 2001) and Anderson Center (Red Wing, MN, USA 2001) initiated his move to the United States.
