Felicia Belair-Rigdon / Artist

The mixed media collage paintings by Felicia Belair-Rigdon have evolved through a concentration on collage incorporating artist-made paper. These works focus on otherworldly matters as a synergy of the artists' early childhood experiences: the Church, the theater and the drama of the auction house. Bringing together disparate imagery of art historical references, angels, sky divers, bones and twigs the surface is worked over with diverse materials unifying and developing a painterly approach to paper. 'These works are shaped by a deep sense of time. . . of ideas past that are relevant to today employing classical excepts seen through the prism of contemorary struggle' . . . Mecklenburg.

The artist is a winner of the Open Studio Press, Exhibition- in- Print 1999, Mid Atlantic division of the New American Panintings judged by Linda Norden, curator of Contemporary Art at Harvard University's Fogg Museum. In addition, Ann Cohen DiPietro of the Heschler Museum awarded a solo exhibition at the Graphic Eye Gallery in Port Washington, NY. The artisit's works have been shown at The Corcoran Gallery of Art, The Virginia Museum of Fine Art, Richmond, VA, the Baltimore Museum and the Chrysler Museum, Newport News, VA.
