Why do you think we tend to be afraid of God's searchlight?

Can you think of anything that's hard to hear about yourself? How might you be living to avoid hearing that thing?

Have you ever experienced the type of brokenness Pastor Craig talked about? What's your story?

Are you trying to stay strong in an area of weakness or hold on to something you need to pour out? What's keeping you from giving it to God?

Describe what a broken and poured out life could look like.

How has God used broken areas from your past to help others?

Name a place you'd love to be sent to and a place you'd never want to be sent to. Why?

Which has been an anchor message for you: Search Me, Break Me, or Send Me?

Do your prayers revolve more around what God can do for you or what you can do for God? Give an example of how you'd like to be praying.

List some typical excuses people give for not going to the places—or doing the work—God calls them to.

Which do you most lack: genuine experience with God, awareness of your sinfulness, or understanding of His grace?

Talk about the last time you felt compelled to do something out of your norm. How did you respond? Could it have been God sending you?

Currently, do you most identify with Jonah, Moses, or Isaiah? What might be keeping you from full surrender to God?

Just like brokenness, being sent is not a one-time experience. To what or where are you being sent now?
