



Camp Ocoee Parent FAQs

Q: Does my student need to bring money?

- No, your student will not need to bring any extra money for camp. Meals will be provided for them on the way to and from camp. Snack shack money will be collected at the Parent Meeting and the morning of registration.

Q: Does my student need to bring a water bottle?

- Your student does not need to bring a water bottle to camp. We will have free disposable water bottles available and ready for them all week long so they can stay hydrated. If your student would like to bring a reusable water bottle, they are welcome to fill that up throughout the day.

Q: What if my student uses all of their snack money before the week is over?

- Students usually have plenty of snack money for the week at camp, but if your student runs out of snack money, don't worry! We will provide three meals a day and a late night snack for everyone.

Q: What if my student wants to call me during the week, but doesn't bring or have a phone?

- Your student's cabin leader will be happy to let them use their phone to call you. Be aware that service may be spotty, but they are always welcome to use a leader's phone to get in touch with you.

Q: What happens if my student gets hurt or sick?

- There will be two nurses coming to camp with us for this specific reason! Since we have every student's emergency contact information, one of those nurses will call you if you need to be informed of anything that happens with your student.

Q: My student takes medication, how is that handled? (Timed medicine, inhalers, epi pens, etc.)

- All allergies and medicines will be handled by our camp nurses as well. Upon registration, there will be a medication form that you can fill out and give to the nurse at the Parent Meeting or the morning that we leave for camp. As far as epi pens and inhalers, they are welcome to keep that on them throughout the week or with their cabin leader, so it is more easily accessible.

Q: How do you handle food allergies?

- We do accommodate in some ways to food allergies. If there is something specific that your child cannot have, please let us know and we will make sure to accommodate to that.

Q: Should I send my students with snacks?

- You are welcome to send your student with snacks. They are allowed to eat them on the bus and have them in the cabin with them.

Q: Is there a dress code?

- Yes. For clothing, no spaghetti straps, strapless shirts, or crop top shirts. No tank tops should be worn that have huge cut outs on the sides. Shorts must be at an appropriate length. For bathing suits, girls must wear a modest, one piece bathing suit that covers all the way down to the hip. For guys, they are required to wear a shirt when not at the waterpark or lake.

Q: What are the themed nights?

- Monday Night is Luau night - Hawaiian shirts welcomed!
- Tuesday is Rodeo Night and we encourage students to dress in their best western attire!
- Wednesday is Team Color Night, where they can rock their rec team color for the lip sync battle.
- Thursday is Throwback Thursday, allowing them to dress in whatever decade they would like!

Q: Can students bring cell phones?

- Students are allowed to bring cell phones, however we do ask that specific guidelines are followed in order to give your student the best camp experience possible. Please refer to the Cell Phone Policy for those guidelines.

Q: When will my student know who is in their group and what color team they are on?

- Your student will know what cabin they are in and what rec team they are on at the Parent Meeting on May 18th. You will also receive an email with those assignments in the weeks leading up to camp.

Q: What will their schedule look like?

Q: Are you requiring or expecting anyone to wear masks or be vaccinated?

- We are not requiring masks or vaccination for Camp Ocoee this year.

Q: What precautions will be taken at the pool and the lake?

- There are lifeguards at the waterpark and the lake all week long. Students will be required to wear lifejackets in the lake and there are lifejackets available for the waterpark as well.

Q: What if we need to cancel?
