Objectively Test Spoken Arabic Skills

The automated test system produces an overall Versant score based on key dimensions of spoken language performance:



Sentence Mastery: The ability to use basic and complex grammatical structures and sentence patterns accurately and appropriately. Scoring focuses on correct usage of words, phrases, and clauses in meaningful structures.



Vocabulary: The ability to understand, recall, and use common everyday words accurately and appropriately. Scoring focuses on the range of vocabulary and the accuracy of its use at the word, phrase, and sentence levels.



Fluency: The ability to maintain smooth speech flow and tempo. Scoring focuses on rate of speaking, the position and length of pauses, rhythm, and phrasing.



Pronunciation: The ability to articulate vowels and consonants in a native-like manner. Scoring focuses on accurate pronunciation and stress placement at the word and sentence level.


