### New cash desks in the Town Hall

Two new cash payment machines are operational for customers in the Town Hall reception.

In addition to the Town Hall payment machines these are the options on how to pay for services by cash:

- PayPoint locations in the town and neighbourhood parades using the council's bank details and customer reference number, which customers can obtain from the Town Hall in the form of a printed barcode
- Banks, building societies and Post Offices using the council's bank details and customer reference

number, which customers already have as a reference on their paperwork – or if not easily available, can be provided by council staff either over the phone or in person.

"It's been a busy few months since I started my second term as Mayor of Crawley.

Despite the distinctly average weather I've managed to dodge the rain and attend plenty of outdoor events over the summer.

A highlight was the annual Armed Forces Day. The Surrey and Sussex Bugle Pipe Band led a procession through the Memorial Gardens and the town centre before we were entertained by music and theatre on the bandstand.

The event also had stands from military partners including The Royal British Legion, 4PWRR, The Crawley and Horsham Veterans' Breakfast Club (my charity for this year), Army Cadets and Air Cadets, plus historical military vehicles, a military exhibition, tombola and refreshments.

I also had two events with Metrobus. Firstly I saw the launch of the new hydrogen bus fleet (see page 21 for more information)

# The Create Building has its first commercial tenant

A company has signed a lease for half of the sixth floor and will move into the building, on The Boulevard in the town centre, in October 2023.

The Create Building is a nine-storey building with five and a half floors of Grade A commercial office space. It's owned by Crawley Borough Council and rental income will help maintain services in the future.



Discussions with other potential tenants are ongoing and it's hoped that it will not be too long before further lettings can be announced.



# Annual canvass begins

Crawley Borough Council's Electoral Services Team has started the annual canvass for the electoral register.

The canvass is an important part of the work of getting everyone in Crawley who is eligible to vote included on the register. Residents will be contacted at different times over the coming months and in different ways, including by email, text, post and a personal visit.

Some of these contacts will need a response, and where no response is received the law requires the council to send reminders, including personal visits to properties.

The council is urging all residents to keep an eye out for their voter registration details to ensure they can vote in upcoming elections.

### Local Plan 2024 to 2040 submitted

# Crawley's Local Plan has been submitted for independent examination.

Crawley Borough Council's vision for Crawley is "a modern, vibrant, healthy and sustainable exemplar digital town that stands proud of its achievements and uses its strengths to reach its potential. Its strong and diverse communities, neighbourhood structure, high quality amenities, bustling neighbourhood parades, sustainable homes and economic growth and excellent connections within and beyond the region will make it a place that people enjoy and want to live, work and visit."

The Local Plan sets out strategic priorities and planning policies to deliver:

- Homes and jobs
- Retail, leisure and other commercial development
- Infrastructure for transport, telecommunications, water supply, wastewater, flood risk management and energy
- Community, social and cultural infrastructure and other facilities
- Climate change mitigation and adaptation
- Conservation and enhancement of the natural, built and historic environment, including landscape and green infrastructure
- Control of Gatwick Airport.

The next stage will be the examination stage, which will include hearings held in public, where the 'soundness' of the Local Plan will be considered by a Secretary of Stateappointed Planning Inspector.

If found 'sound', the council will be able to formally adopt the new Local Plan, meaning that its strategic planning policies and principles can shape the future of the town and be used in the consideration of planning applications.

# Council grants for local groups

Ten charities and community groups have been awarded a total of £10,567 in small grants by Crawley Borough Council.

Grants of between £50 and £2.500. are paid out to groups who aim to foster greater levels of community activity through their projects and events for Crawley residents and visitors to the borough.

### The latest grants are:

- Free Shop Crawley £2,376 for mental health conference events and workshops for clients
- Crawley Swimming Club £1,000 for enhanced training for coaches to enable the club to grow
- New Note Projects £1,000 for music workshops with Crawley Open House residents
- Happy Hours Pre-school £1,000 for safe play activities in Broadfield
- Sussex Association for Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus - £1,000 for support services in Crawley

- Crawley Interfaith Network £1,000 for project and event costs
- Melting Pot Project £1,000 for English language support at Crawley Youth Centre
- Crawley Jumma Group £1,000 for hall hire and activities for this women's social and community group
- Swim-1st Triathlon Club £691 for bursaries and promotional banners
- Phoenix Choir of Crawley £500 to enable the choir to take part in community events.

The small grants scheme is open to all community groups and clubs whose activities take place in, or benefit, the Crawley area. Typically, the council awards a grant or funding contribution to most proposals that are eligible for support and also provides matchfunding opportunities.

# Five Crawley parks retain their Green Flag status



All five Crawley parks have retained

their Green Flag Awards, with Tilgate Park achieving the status for 21 consecutive years.

Tilgate Park, Goffs Park, Memorial Gardens, Worth Park and Ifield Mill Pond all kept their Green Flag Awards for 2023.

The Green Flag Award scheme, managed by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy under licence from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, recognises and rewards well-managed parks and green spaces, setting the benchmark standard for the management of green spaces across the United Kingdom and around the world.

Goffs Park has now been awarded the Green Flag 15 times. The popular park features a lake, miniature railway and great play facilities.

For Memorial Gardens, this is also its 15th Green Flag. Situated in the heart of the town centre, the gardens are the perfect place for shoppers and workers to relax and enjoy the colourful surroundings.

This is the fifth consecutive year that Worth Park has been awarded a Green Flag with the historic park's formal gardens, a stunning fountain, stone balustrading, a listed rockery, a wooded lake, a meadow, croquet lawns and a tennis court impressing the judges.

Worth Park has also again received a Green Heritage Site Accreditation, supported by Historic England, for the management of its historic features.

Ifield Mill Pond has received the Green Flag Award for the fourth year running. Considered the most important wetland site in the town and designated a Site of Nature Conservation Importance, the beautiful area features Bewbush Water Gardens, an area of semiformal ponds and natural planting.

# Virtual parking permits coming to Crawley

### Virtual parking permits are being introduced across Crawley from October.

As part of the West Sussex County Council Integrated Parking Strategy, virtual on-street parking permits for controlled parking zones will come into operation from 2 October 2023.

From this date, new and renewal resident, visitor and business permits will be purchased online. Permit holders will be contacted by email (or letter if the council doesn't have an email address) before their permit is due for renewal. Unused paper visitor permits can still be used after 2 October.

The move to virtual permits means there will be no need to display paper permits in vehicle windows. Drivers simply purchase their permit online and receive an email notification when it is active.

Civil Enforcement Officers will be able to confirm if a vehicle has a valid digital permit via the vehicle registration number.

The move away from paper and plastic permits is designed to benefit the environment, remove the waiting time of receiving a physical permit, provide greater convenience for customers and reduce the risk of loss or theft.

The virtual permits are provided by MiPermit. The system enables customers to purchase and manage their parking permits online, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, after creating an account. MiPermit can be accessed through the council's website or by telephone.

Residents without online access will still be able to request a paper application from Crawley Borough Council's Parking Services Team on **01293 438696**. Once you have a MiPermit account, to purchase and activate visitor permits you will be able to call MiPermit's dedicated call centre.

West Sussex County Council is increasing its charges for parking permits from 2 October. A resident permit will cost £58 and subsequent permits will cost £116. Non-resident permits will cost £350. There will no change to the cost of visitor permits.



### **CCTV** installed in Memorial Gardens

Two CCTV cameras have been installed in the Memorial Gardens in the town centre following concerns about crime and anti-social behaviour from residents and businesses.

The cameras have been purchased by the Safer Crawley Partnership, which has secured funding via the Safer Streets 4 programme.

The high specification cameras are equipped with infrared night vision capability to ensure that even with low-light conditions, those involved with crime can still be easily identified.

It is hoped that the cameras will provide reassurance to those using the gardens and increase their sense of safety, particularly when the gardens are less busy.

The cameras can be live streamed to Sussex Police headquarters and accessed by officers at Crawley Police Station. This will support ongoing efforts to identify individuals involved in crime and to support prosecutions against those who misuse the space.



The Safer Crawley Partnership is a statutory partnership which requires the council, the police and a range of partners to work together to reduce and prevent crime.

# Hydrogen in, water out!

### Twenty hydrogen buses have joined the Metrobus fleet to operate on Fastway routes between Crawley and Gatwick.

Metrobus has launched a pioneering fleet of hydrogen fuel cell buses to carry passengers on Fastway routes 10 and 20 operating in the Gatwick Airport, Manor Royal, Crawley and Horley areas.

Once fully delivered, the fleet will comprise 54 vehicles and will be one of the biggest hydrogen bus fleets in Britain. It will be served by a liquid hydrogen refuelling station - the largest of its kind in Europe.

The zero emission buses are able to cover long ranges and carry heavy loads, making them ideal for local Fastway routes around Gatwick that are intensively used – operating 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

- Hydrogen is one of the most sustainable ways to operate a bus service because all that comes out the tailpipe is water
- A further 34 vehicles will join the fleet over the next 18 months, in partnership with Surrey County Council, to create one of Britain's largest hydrogen bus fleets, and one of the largest zero emissions bus fleets in Europe

 The station is the first liquid hydrogen refuelling station for buses in Europe.

Metrobus is also investing in bus priority measures to make sure buses turn up on time, more real time passenger information for users to plan journeys and providing more ondemand bus services.

# Crawley's newest Changing Places opens at The Hawth

# A new Changing Places toilet – the second in Crawley – has opened at The Hawth.

Crawley Borough Council was awarded a grant of £97,000 from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) to install Changing Places toilets at The Hawth and K2 Crawley leisure centre.

Changing Places toilets are designed for people who cannot use standard accessible toilets.

The council has worked with The Hawth's operator, Parkwood Leisure, on the installation of these new amenities to enable more people to access the regional arts centre.

A Changing Places toilet is already available in County Mall shopping centre. Facilities at K2 Crawley and the Town Hall on The Boulevard will open later this year.

Lifeline is a personal alarm for anyone living in Crawley to use at home in an emergency, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. One press of the button connects you to our Alarm Receiving Centre, where an operator will take your call and get you the appropriate help.

The Lifeline service allows you to maintain your independence and feel safe in your own home.

Our GPS tracker is suitable for those who like to get out and about and may need to call for help suddenly. The operator will be able to send help to your exact location.

Additional equipment, such as smoke or heat detectors, that works with a Lifeline and automatically contacts the Alarm Receiving Centre, is also available.

### Free installation, small weekly rent

The weekly rental charge for a personal alarm includes a responsive repair and replace service of our equipment, an annual service visit from the Lifeline Team and access to an operator 24 hours a day.

For extra peace of mind, we can offer a key safe as part of your Lifeline package. If you don't have any local contacts, a key safe is a good alternative to enable access into your home in an emergency. Your key holders can be family, friends or neighbours who are happy to respond to your calls.

# Gatwick Airport Northern Runway project

Gatwick Airport Limited (GAL) is seeking to bring its northern 'standby' runway, which is currently only used for emergency purposes or where the main runway is closed for maintenance, into routine operational use. This is referred to by the airport operator as the Gatwick Airport Northern Runway Project.

The proposal would bring about a substantial increase in both air traffic and the number of passengers using the airport.

This growth would require significant development at the airport to accommodate the increased activity and passenger volumes, including major extensions to existing facilities, new hotels, more car parking, major road improvements and extensive landscaping and ecology works.


The Planning Inspectorate accepted GAL's application at the beginning of August for examination.

The 10 local authorities surrounding London Gatwick have released a joint statement that can be found at crawley.gov.uk/planning

The council is able to submit feedback into the DCO process in its statutory role as a host authority, working with its neighbouring local authorities to scrutinise and steer GAL's proposals to achieve the best outcomes from the project, should it go ahead.
