

The 10th Annual Texas Primary Care Consortium Summit took place in Austin, Texas, on September 8-9, 2022. With a theme of "A Decade of Powering Primary Care Transformation," the summit honored the past 10 years of convening health champions in our shared pursuit of improving the health of Texans through accessible, equitable, and coordinated person-centered primary care.

The summit framework was based upon three focus areas:

Person-Centered Care Delivery

Presenters demonstrated how to organize and structure a practice to deliver efficient, effective, and comprehensive care while prioritizing the unique needs and circumstances of each patient. Sessions addressed care planning, teambased care, data sharing methods, and coordination and collaboration among multiple providers to enhance patient experiences, improve health outcomes, and reduce costs.

Paying for Primary Care

Presentations in this focus area included sessions that highlighted how to increase investment into primary care while reducing overall costs and financial barriers. Presenters addressed the linkage between finance and outcomes, including proven approaches to payment reform, value-based purchasing, waivers, revenue cycle management, and cost-reduction.


Innovative Approaches

Sessions prioritized how to advance equitable, comprehensive, and sustainable primary care for all Texans with emerging science, pilot programs, and new methods. Participants discussed new ideas for addressing the variety of challenges presented by our health care system, including care delivery, collaboration, data sharing, social determinants of health, access to health care, practice transformation, administration, payment, and workforce capacity.

Integrating Behavioral Health

Several speakers highlighted the importance of integrating behavioral health into primary care settings since separate systems would lead to fragmented care delivery, poor health outcomes, higher health care costs, and duplication of services. Baylor College of Medicine helped participants understand their clinical processes that enabled behavioral health integration while Mental Health America of Greater Houston walked through their tools for assessing quality improvement for patients.

Informing Policy

Throughout the summit, primary care informing policy was a consistent topic of discussion. The Thursday afternoon plenary explored key issues and solutions to advancing access to care for all Texans while also improving health outcomes, reducing disparities, and lowering costs. The closing plenary discussed *advanced primary care* that by design shifts the focus of primary care towards quality. The transition towards this new payment model has been encouraging and, paired with policy, is the way forward.



The 10th Annual Summit was not only significant for its milestone anniversary, but also an exciting return to convening in-person after two years of being virtual. We had the opportunity to celebrate accomplishments including the Camille D. Miller, MSSW, honorary lecture and the inaugural Primary Care Champion Award given to Elena Marks, JD, MPH, Episcopal Health Foundation. This year's gathering further fueled our energy to facilitate collective action to advance equitable, comprehensive, and sustainable primary care for all Texans.


