<p>L.O:</p> <p>To Write The First Draft Of My Nursery Rhyme.</p>	<p>VCOP/S/G – Calligrams (15 minutes) Start by introducing calligrams to your pupils, explaining how they visually represent the meaning of a word. Discuss a number of different words and how they may be written to make them a calligram (i.e. <i>fluffy, bang, wobbly, grow, short, slime</i>). If you have time, print out the calligram worksheet from the tools and resources sections and have the class complete it.</p> <p>MAIN TEACHING – BIG write prep (10 minutes) Ensure your pupils have their nursery rhyme titles and ideas for first and second lines. Hold a brief recap on the meaning of alliteration, rhyming, rhyming couplets, syllables and rhythm. Reassure the class that they don't have to use all of these in their nursery rhyme.</p> <p>MAIN TASK – BIG write - first draft (30 minutes) Play some calming music (GUIDANCE – suggested music 'Chopin - Piano Concerto Collection') to assist with focus as the class writes their nursery rhymes.</p> <p>PLENARY – (5 minutes) Those that finish first can offer to help others still writing their nursery rhymes, and share ideas for additional rhyming words, couplets and alliteration.</p>	<p>Materials Required:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Calligram worksheet ▶ Paper ▶ Pens or pencils ▶ Nursery Rhyme titles and first lines <p>Key Words:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Calligram ▶ Chopin <p>HA Extension: If they finish the main task in a short time have the pupils pick out and write any words from their own work that could be turned into Calligrams.</p> <p>Success Criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ I wrote my Nursery Rhyme using rhyming words. ▶ I wrote my Nursery Rhyme using rhyming couplets and alliteration. ▶ I wrote my Nursery Rhyme using rhyming couplets as well as rhyming words and alliteration.
