



Colourful Character Worksheet

TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET

Required Material:

- ▶ The supplementary colouring sheets
- ▶ Colouring pens or pencils

L.O:

- ▶ To be able match colours with different personalities.
- ▶ To be able to match colours with different moods.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Discuss how different colours could represent different moods and personalities and why this might be, and if colours could possibly change the way someone feels.

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Tell the class that we will be analysing the character that we have recently met and colouring them in not based on their actual colours, but based on what we think they should look like when thinking about their personalities.

Before performing the main task however, we will be thinking about the colours that represent us and matching those colours to our personality traits.

Ask for volunteers to share with the class what colours they think represent them and why they think this is.

MAIN TASK - Colourful Character (15mins)

For this task we will be looking at the Beastie Berg and colouring in our pictures using the colours we feel best represent her personality.

There are three different elements to Berg's personality, have the children choose which one they think suits the picture and colour it accordingly.

- 1 Berg is an iceberg, which means there is more beneath the surface than first meets the eye. She prefers to keep much of herself hidden, whether that's her body under the water or her emotions beneath her icy exterior.
- 2 When Berg's emotions get the better of her and she feels like she's about to burst, she gets hot and very bothered and the hotter she gets the quicker she melts.
- 3 Like all of us, sometimes things just get a bit too much for Berg and she melts and falls apart. But she is always able to pick up the pieces and rebuild herself stronger than she was before.

PLENARY (2mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Together discuss what else could represent certain characteristics, such as sound or smell.

DID YOU KNOW!

Livestock such as cows and sheep burp and fart around 3.1 gigatonnes (1 billion tons) of methane into the atmosphere every year. Find out how else the meat industry impacts our environment in the Ethics of Cow Farts lesson.



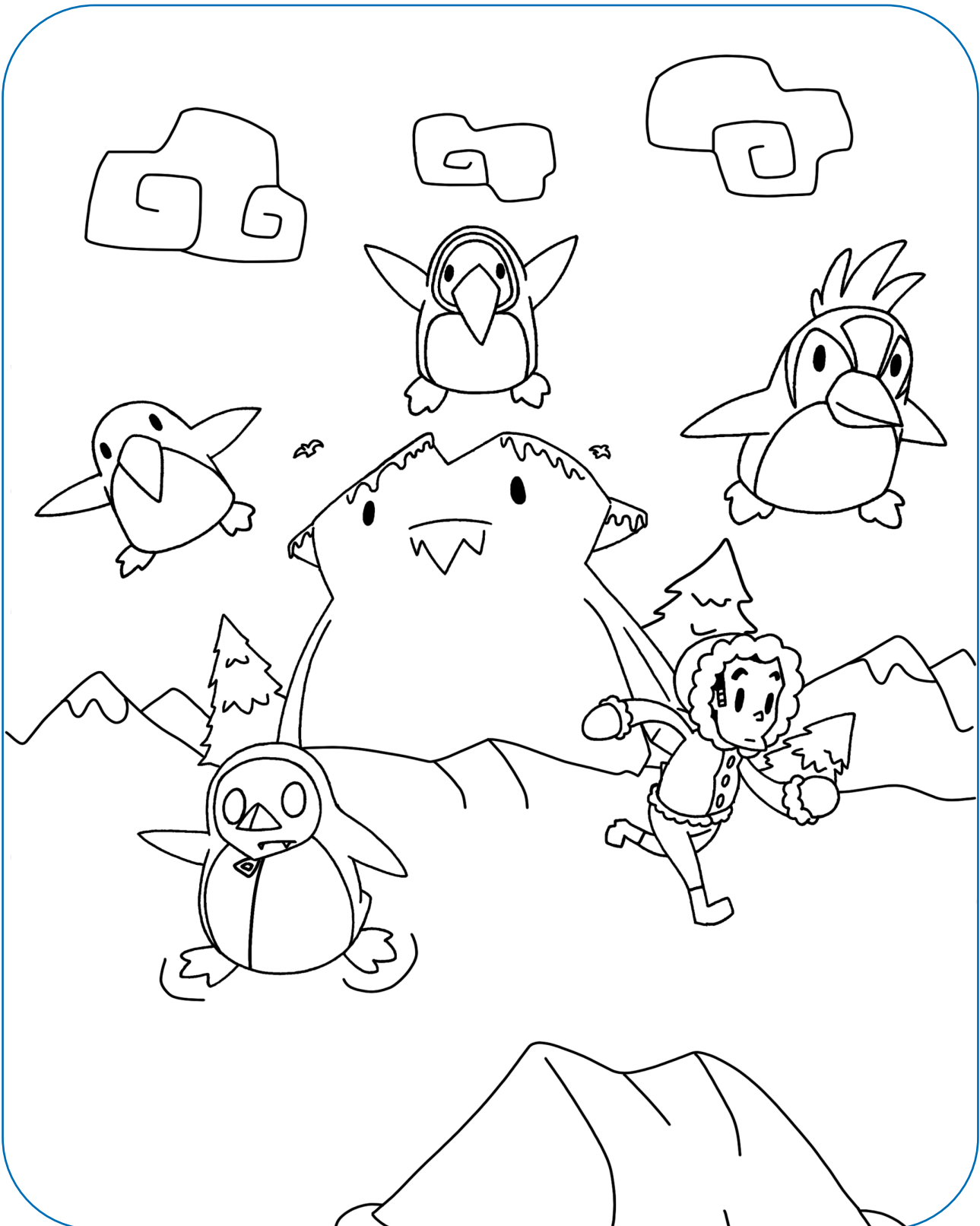
