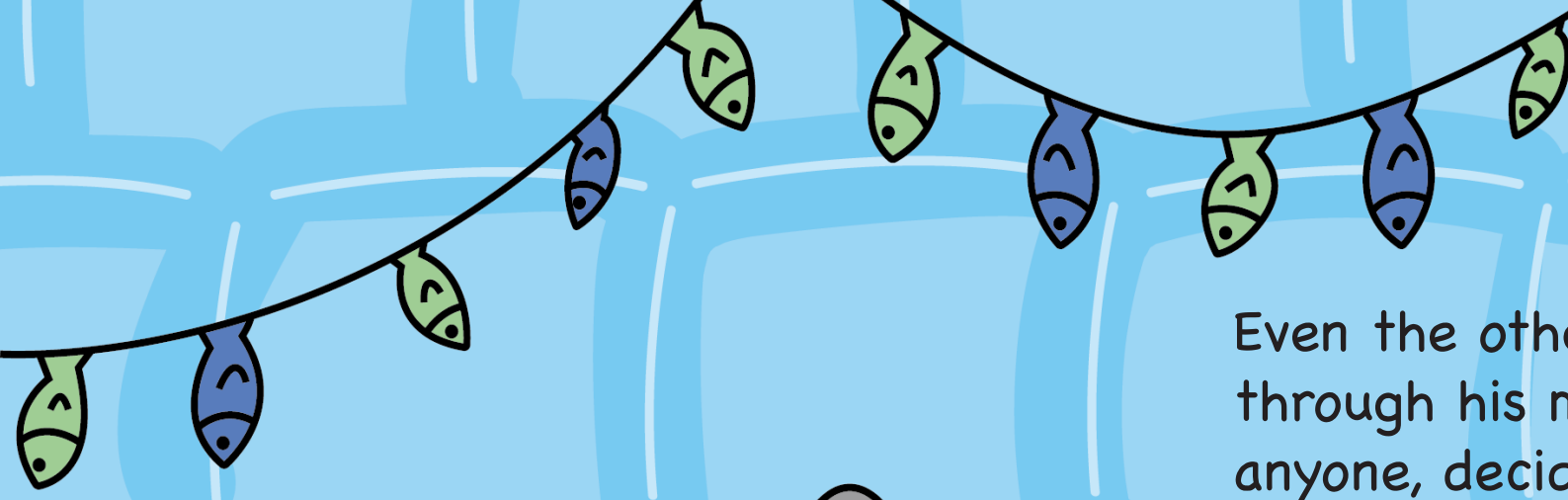


Oscar had travelled to the South Pole in search of a Wellness Orb that could help take the Beasties home, but instead he found some new friends who needed his help.

The problem was, Mimic didn't know who exactly to invite. So he invited everyone.



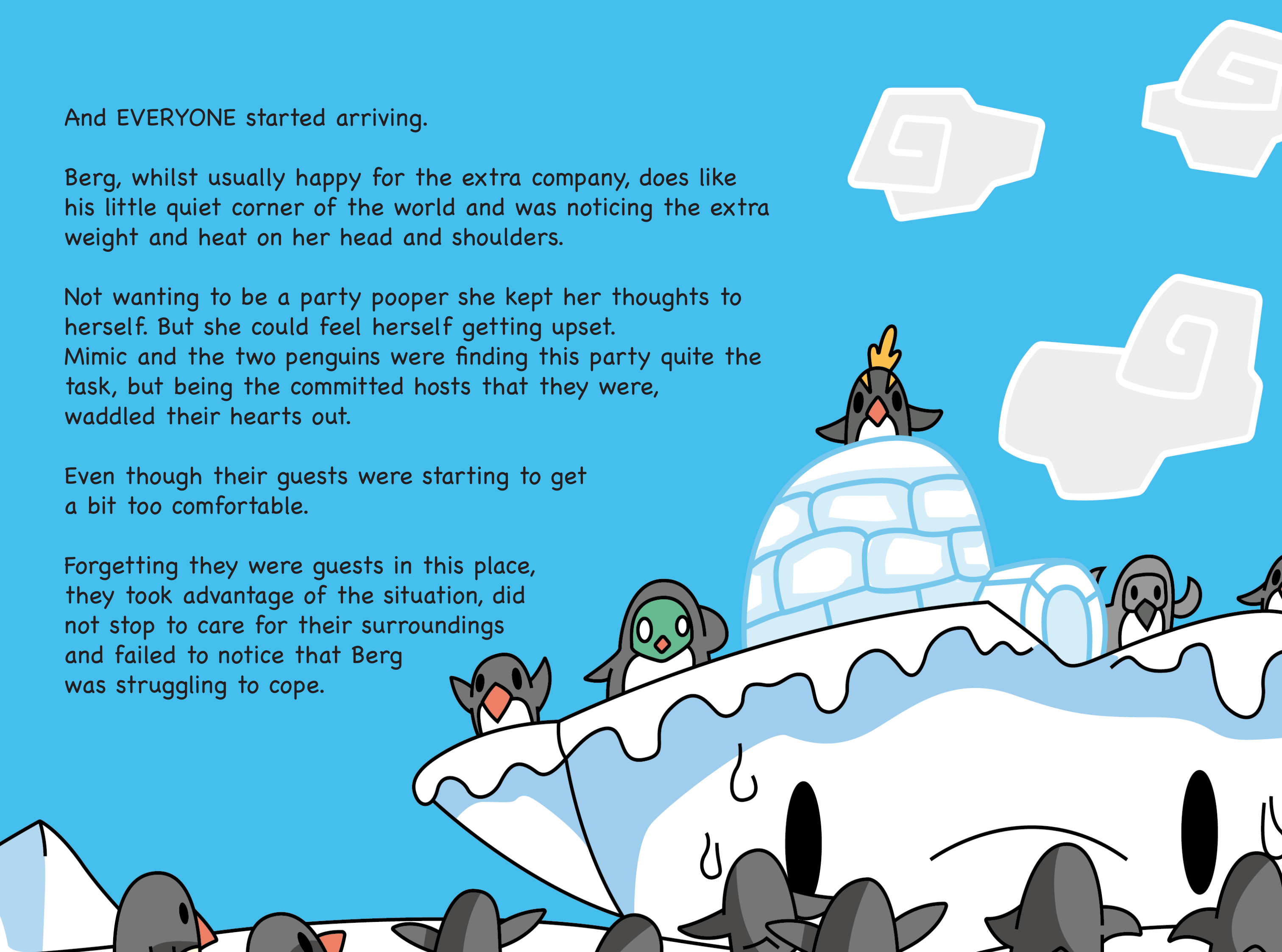
And EVERYONE started arriving.

For Berg, it had become too much, she overheated and couldn't keep her emotions under control. Exploding out of the water like a shaken bottle of fizzy pop...

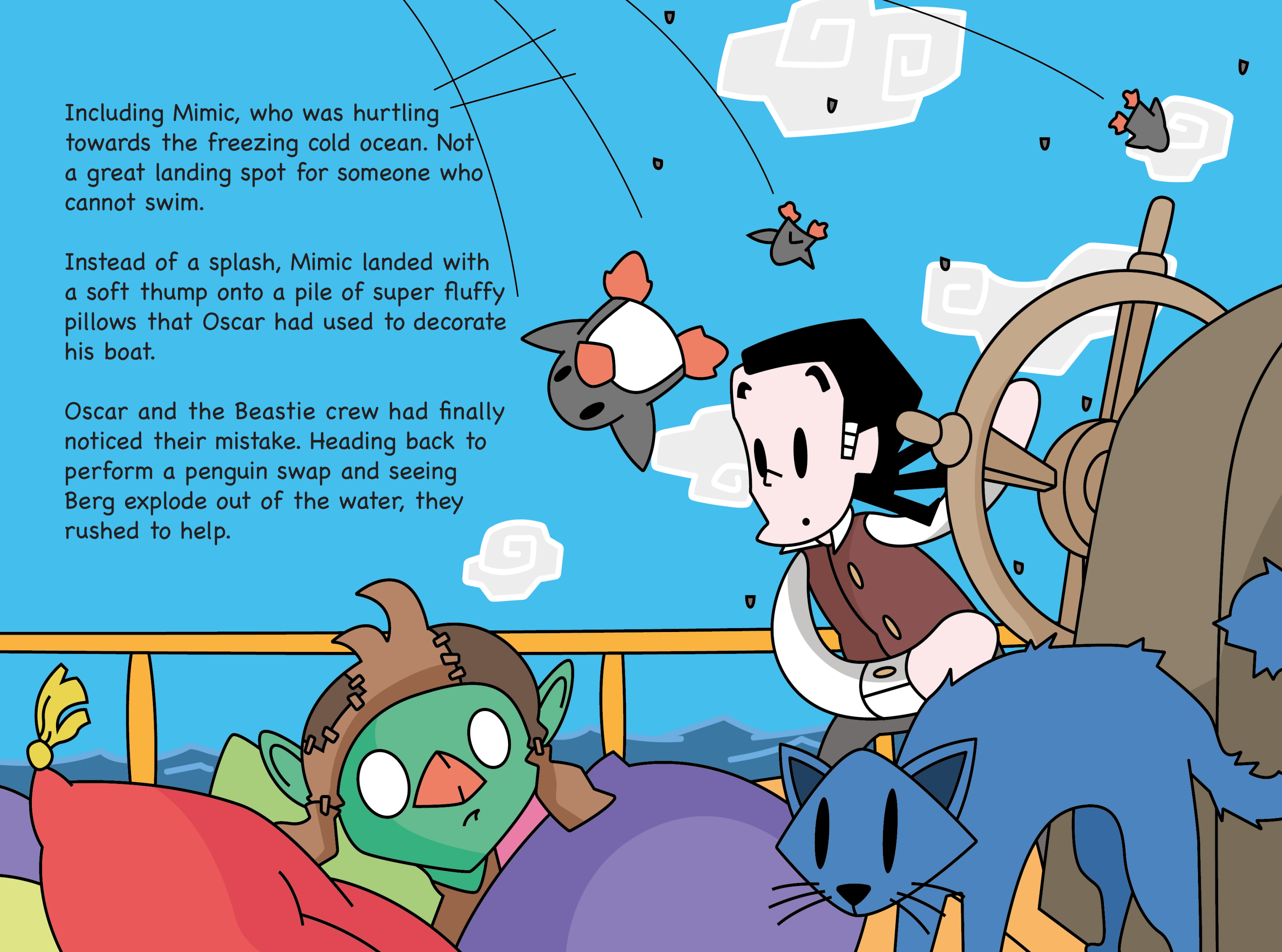
...she sent the partygoers flying like little penguin shaped rockets.
