Right Where I Belong Worksheet

TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET

Required Material:

- ► Supplementary worksheet
- ▶ Colouring Pens
- ▶ Pencils

L.O:

- ► To recognise that you belong.
- To understand how you can make a difference where you belong.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

Display the word 'belonging' for the students and ask them to define what they think it means to belong. Ask the class to think of ways that we belong in our classroom and how we can make a difference within our class.

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Take the time to speak about how the Fever Folk felt they didn't belong when they were in new surroundings. Discuss why they may have been feeling this way and how they could create a sense of belonging in these new surroundings. Also highlight the importance of making others feel like they belong if they are new to something. Provide an example for the class highlighting how we may feel like we don't belong at first but when we get to know our new surroundings and contribute to them in a positive way, we will feel a sense of belonging.

MAIN TASK - Right Where I Belong (15mins)

For this task ask the students to think about where they belong in this world and where they think they could make a difference. For example: I think I can make a difference with my family, I think I can make a difference being a doctor, I think I could make a difference in my team sport etc.

Using the supplementary worksheet design an environment in which you think you belong. Students can choose to write and/or draw on their worksheet to explain their environment and how they belong in it.

PLENARY (2mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Ask the class to briefly reflect on their sense of belonging that they have explored in their worksheet. Question the students on how they can make a difference in this place they belong. Ensure the class have a good understanding that we can belong almost anywhere as long as we treat it well and take care of it as it as we take care of ourselves.

DID YOU KNOW!
