

Colourful Character Analysis Worksheet

TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET

Required Material:

- ▶ The supplementary colouring sheets
- ▶ Colouring pens or pencils

L.O:

- ▶ To be able match colours with different personalities .
- ▶ To be able to match colours with different feelings.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Discuss how different colours could represent different moods and personalities, why this might be and if colours could possibly change the way someone feels.

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Tell the children that we will be analysing the characters that we have recently met and colouring them in not based on their actual colours, but based on what we think they should look like when thinking about their personalities.

Before performing the main task however, we will be thinking about the colours that represent us and matching those colours to our personality traits.

Ask for volunteers to share with the other children what colours they think represent them and why they think this is.

MAIN TASK - Colourful Character (15mins)

For this task we will be looking at the Beasties the Fever Folk and colouring in their pictures using the colours we feel best represent their personality.

There are two different elements to the Fever Folk's personality represented in the following two black

and white pictures. Have the children choose which one and colour it accordingly.

PLENARY (2mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Together discuss what else could represent certain characteristics, such as sound or smell.

DID YOU KNOW!
