

My Treasure Trove Worksheet

TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET

Required Material:

- ▶ The My Treasure Trove supplementary worksheet
- ▶ Pens or pencils

L.O:

- ▶ To recognise the elements of my personality or life that make me a wealthy person.
- ▶ To understand the deeper meaning of wealth and how it applies to being a good person.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Ask the children to discuss what wealth means to them and what makes someone a “wealthy” person.

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Tell the children that we will be discussing treasure, but not in the traditional sense. The treasure we will be talking about is that which adds wealth to us as individuals. Explain that what we mean by that is being a wholesome person, looking at what makes a person so and why they think that is the case.

Ask the children for volunteers to suggest things that they think make them ‘wealthy’ and why they think that is. These could be things like having a pet, because it is something they must take care of, or having a talent like playing music that they can entertain others with, baking cakes that they can share with others, or simply being a kind person.

MAIN TASK - My Treasure Trove (15mins)

GUIDANCE – For this activity we will be thinking about the things that make us wealthy as individuals. If a child is having difficulty thinking of things about themselves, you can pair them up with another child and have them think of things about each other.

Using the treasure chest template have the children draw or write inside the chest each of the treasures that they think make them a wealthy individual. These treasures can be traits that make them a good, happy, loyal or ambitious person (you can suggest other features that make them a wealthy person).

PLENARY (2mins)

Ask for volunteers to present their treasure chests to the rest of the children to see if they can think of examples of when that child has displayed the traits they have presented.

DID YOU KNOW!

Real life treasure hunter, Sean Fisher reckons there is about \$60 billion (£43 billion+) still in the ocean. Unfortunately people are less likely to hunt for plastic in the ocean. Explore our science lesson which looks at the impact of plastic in our oceans.

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CHILDREN'S SHEET

Using the treasure chest template draw or write under neath the chest each of the treasures that you think makes you a wealthy person. These treasures can be features that make you a good, happy, loyal or ambitious person for example.
