TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET

Required Material:

- ▶ Pens / Pencils

L.O:

- ▶ To set myself a task that I will aim to achieve over the summer break.
- ▶ To understand how and why I must be accountable for my actions.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – As a group discuss the meaning of accountability and why it is an important trait in any person.

ourselves to complete a scavenger hunt that will last the whole summer.

Individually, have the children list (or draw) 20 items that they, under their own management, must find and collect over the summer. Then think of a reward that they can give themselves once they have completed their scavenger hunt as an incentive.

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Having understood that accountability means taking responsibility for your actions lead the children on to thinking about a scenario where the only person they are accountable to is themselves. So if they don't do something they said they were going to do, no one but them would be affected.

PLENARY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Have the class discuss the meaning of discipline and how it can be used to help their scavenger hunt.

Ask for volunteers to suggest why it is important to to hold yourself accountable for the things you do or say, even when it doesn't impact anyone else.

Tell the children that doing so can help us when setting ourselves goals and working towards them. Holding ourselves accountable can help us be more successful, happy and productive.

MAIN TASK - Scavengers Assemble (15mins)

Tell the children that we can practice being accountable by setting ourselves small and simple tasks and work towards completing them.
