TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET

Required Material:

- ► The supplementary colouring sheets
- Colouring pens or pencils

L.O:

- ► To be able match colours with different personalities.
- ➤ To be able to match colours with different moods.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Discuss how different colours could represent different moods and personalities and why this might be, and if colours could possibly change the way someone feels.

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Tell the children that we will be analysing the Beastie in this story and colouring them not based on their actual colours, but on what we think they should look like when thinking about their personality.

Before performing the main task however, we will be thinking about the colours that represent us and matching those colours to our personality traits.

Ask for volunteers to share with the children what colours they think represent them and why they think this is.

MAIN TASK - Colourful Character (15mins)

For this task we will be looking at the Beastie, Foggy. To refresh the children's memories read out the descriptions below.

► Foggy

Foggy is a cat, cats like to feel important. But sometimes when he isn't getting enough attention

Foggy can feel really neglected and wander off in search of a back scratch and some cat treats.

We can help Foggy by letting him know how important he is to us, but not spoiling him with attention as this could mean he ends up expecting it from everyone.

PLENARY (2mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Together discuss what else could represent certain characteristics, such as sound or smell.
