TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET

L.O:

- ▶ To know the 5 Ws and the H.
- ▶ To know how to use them to gather information.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Together talk about the following: How does gathering information help us in our daily lives? How does it enhance our social awareness and communication skills?

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Leading on from the Group Discussion tell the children that being well-informed allows us to better understand the world around us and interact with others in a more meaningful way.

Explain that being socially aware means being aware of the feelings, needs, and perspectives of the people around us. Gathering information helps us gain insights into different cultures, beliefs, and experiences. For any given situation we need not think about the five Ws, and the H. See if the children can guess what these are.

Tell them that the 5Ws stand for Who, What, Why, Where and When, and the H stands for How. Gathering this information can help us see any situation more clearly.

To improve our information gathering skills, we can read books, explore reliable online sources, and engage in discussions with diverse groups of people. It's important to critically evaluate information

and consider different perspectives. By continuously seeking knowledge, we become more informed and socially aware individuals.

MAIN TASK - (15mins)

Tell the children that being fully informed equips us with knowledge and facts, enabling us to communicate effectively. When we have accurate information, we can express our thoughts and opinions clearly.

Pair the children up and have them take turns explaining something about themselves that the other may not know. The other person must take notes covering the 5 Ws and the H to make sure they understand as much about what they have been told as possible.

PLENARY (2mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Ask for volunteers to share their 5 Ws and the H with the other children and see if they can communicate what they have been told.

DID YOU KNOW!

The Loughton sheep is a rare native breed of Manx sheep which has four huge horns (and sometimes six!).
