

THE ISLE OF MAGNIFICENT

My Proud Moments Worksheet

TEACHER GUIDANCE SHEET



Required Material:

- ▶ The My Proud Moments Worksheet
- ▶ Pens / Pencils

L.O:

- ▶ To understand the difference between being proud and showing off.
- ▶ To feel pride in my achievements and share them with others.

STARTING ACTIVITY (5mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Together talk about the difference between being proud of ourselves and being arrogant, or showing off. See if the group can identify which is better.

MAIN TASK - (15mins)

Ask the children to think about and write down the top three things they are most proud of. It can be an achievement, a personal quality, a skill, or anything they feel proud of.

MAIN TEACHING (10mins)

Tell the children that today, we will explore the importance of feeling pride in our own qualities. Feeling proud of ourselves and our accomplishments is a wonderful thing. It helps us appreciate who we are and boosts our self-confidence.

We will also learn that it's okay to 'show off' our achievements occasionally. Ask the children if they can share a time when they felt proud of something they did or achieved?"

List out the different things that they might feel proud of.

- 1 Celebrating Accomplishments:** It's important to recognize and celebrate our achievements, no matter how big or small.
- 2 Unique Qualities:** We all have special qualities and talents that make us who we are. It's important to embrace and take pride in them.
- 3 Sharing with Others:** It's okay to show off our accomplishments from time to time, as long as we do it respectfully and without bragging.

Divide students into pairs or small groups. Encourage students to take turns sharing their proud moments with their group members. After each sharing, the other students should listen attentively and ask questions or offer positive comments.

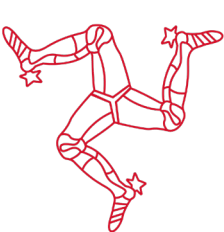
Once everyone has had a chance to share, reconvene as a whole class for a group discussion.

PLENARY (2mins)

GROUP DISCUSSION – Ask for volunteers to share their proud moments and have the group comment on why that child should be proud.

DID YOU KNOW!
