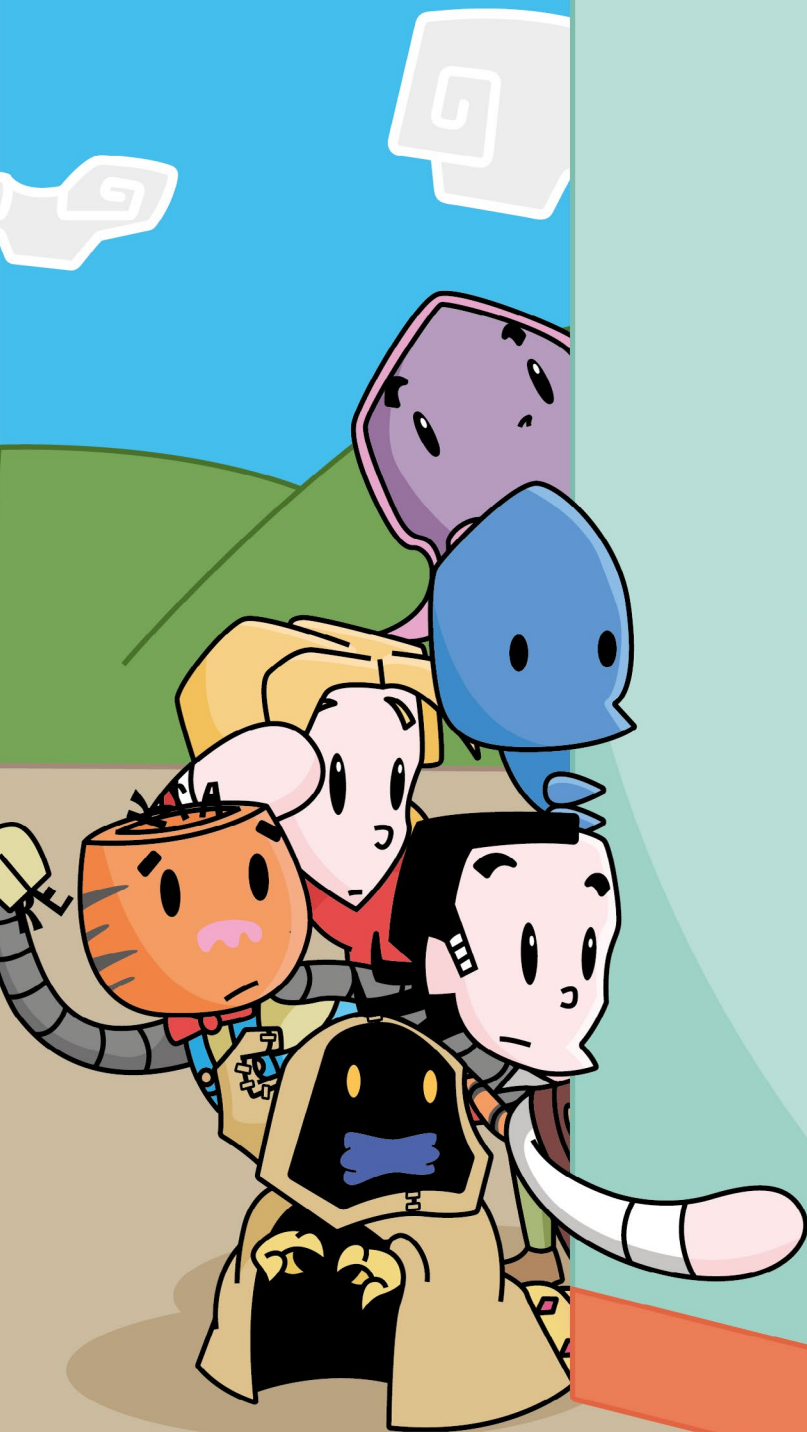

ever met.

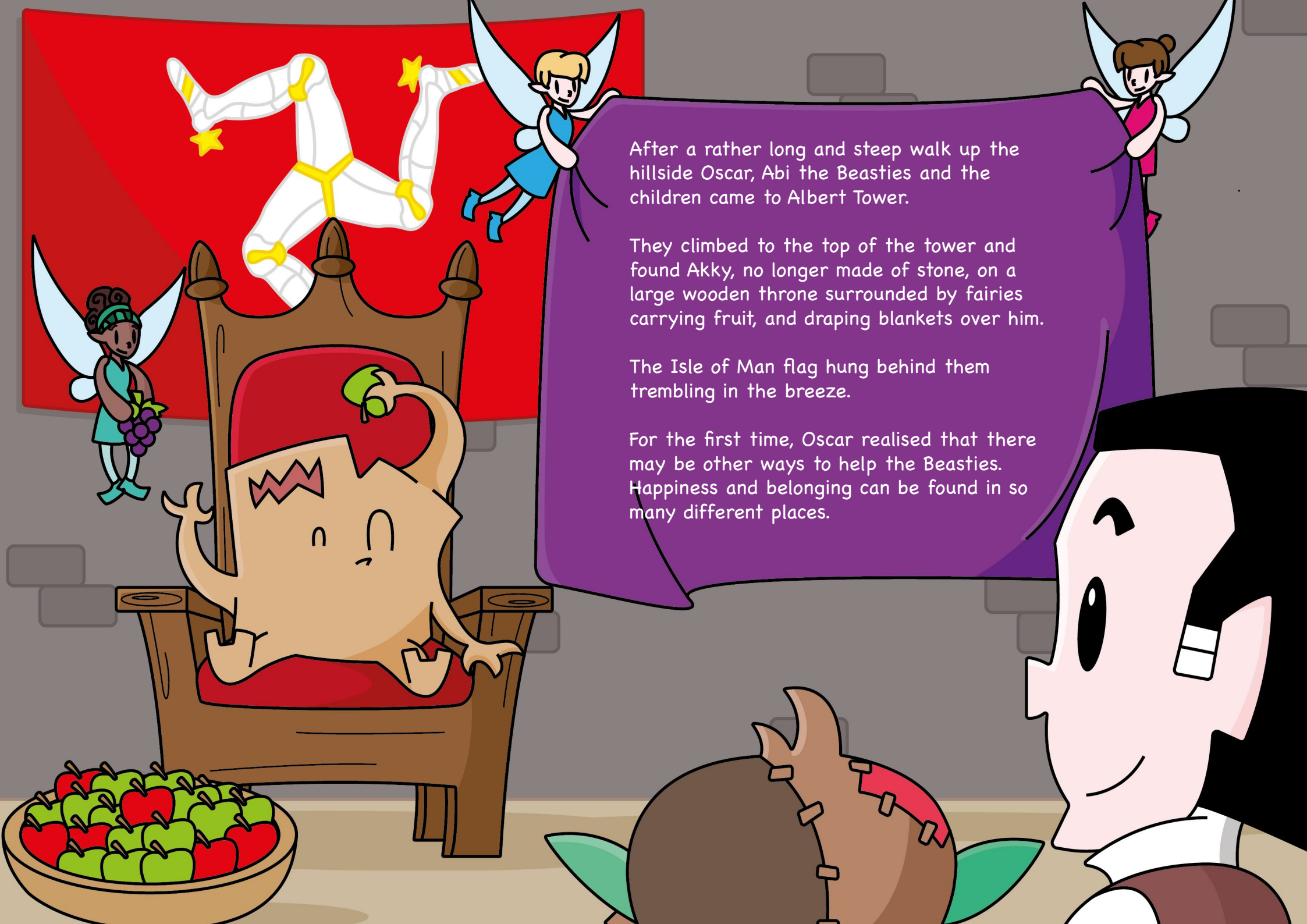


The children agreed to go with them back to the bridge, where they helped put it back in its right place and reunite the two groups.
