




To increase public understanding of the early signs and symptoms of pancreatic cancer, the diagnostic pathways, and the treatment options.

- 15% increase overall for likes/followers.


We more than tripled the goal on YouTube and our Let's Talk Pancreatic Cancer (Facebook Group).


Overall we increased by over 50% in 2023, the goal was 15%.





### **META**

Twitter/X has been a little different this year, as we all know. We continue to analyze and discover how to increase impressions and engagements. For example, after taking part in a #PancChat we would have more than the usual amount of traffic for the next few days.

Our impressions are down from 468,515 in 2022 to 90,300 in 2023 but our engagement rate is much higher than the average. The average is 0.02% - 0.09% our overall average rate of engagement for 2023 is 3.2%. Throughout the year it was as high as 4.3% and only went as low as 1.6%

Your generosity and belief in our work along with your willingness to lend a helping hand is crucial for our success now and in the future, and we are truly grateful. However, there is still a lot of work to be done. Despite our progress, there are ongoing challenges like the following:

- 90% of Canadians diagnosed with pancreatic cancer are not expected to survive past the five year mark

  It is the 11th most commonly diagnosed cancer in Canada but it is the third
- Heading cause of cancer deaths
   There are no screening tests (like there are for breast or colon cancers) over 50% of those diagnosed will pass within the first 4-6 months. Most patients are diagnosed when the disease is advanced and treatment options are
- limited Lack of Healthcare Education understanding of best practices
- · Research funding is low, less than 5% of cancer funding goes to pancreatic


### **PATIENT SUPPORT**

Our objective is to empower patients and caregivers with knowledge, enabling them to self-advocate for the best, current standard of care and access to clinical trials.

Our patient support services support a wide range of needs and we know, from feedback from those that have used our services, that they offer vital support.

However, we also know that there are a significant number of patients and caregivers who would benefit from patient support services who are not accessing them.

Since June 2020, we have made strides to address this unmet need by investing in our marketing to Cancer Centres and healthcare professionals offering free healthcare presentations about our programs and pancreatic cancer. This has led to an increase in awareness of our organization and services. We are committed to being there for every Canadian – no matter the province or territory. We aim to increase the uptake of our direct patient services by 25%.



From our research we know that every patient should have;

- a surgical consult, see a medical oncologist
- a dietician or nutritionist working with them.
- supplemental psychological and recreational care through a social worker (this improves their quality of life)
- information about clinical trials before any treatment is imperative to empower informed decisions about their care.

We also know that early detection saves lives and any patients with two or more first-degree relatives with pancreatic cancer should see a genetic counselor to further assess their risk. These responses show us that we need more awareness around referrals and the importance they play in pancreatic cancer patients quality of life and outcomes.

Our National Pancreas Conference took place November 18th and 19th, 2023 in person in Montreal, Quebec. We hosted over 65 medical professionals in person and virtually.

In addition to the National Pancreas Conference 2023 planning, six branded research awards were established with criteria, timelines and peer review committees, which celebrated various levels of pancreatic cancer research.

- Two Poster Board Presentations (\$750 each)
- Two Junior Researcher Awards (\$7500 each)
- Two Senior Researcher Awards (\$75,000 each)

This conference was a great success with 70% of participants stating the information they learned will change the way they treat and care for patients diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. Feedback also indicated that participants found the opportunity to collaborate with other pancreatic cancer specialists was valuable and 90% of attendees strongly felt the learning objectives of the conference were met.

For future conferences, attendees would be interested in seeing more patient participation and some sessions with interactive elements and/or working groups to allow engagement and further collaboration.

To address this interest in working groups, it is tentatively planned that every odd year we will hold a conference and every even year will facilitate working groups that will move forward opportunities for change within the healthcare sector.



We are excited to announce that with the successful partnerships of The Canadian Digest Health Foundation, Native Marketing and support from Viatris, we were able to create the World's first Pancreatic Enzyme Replacement Calculator Application.

This initiative started in August 2022, launched in February 2023 and is approved by Health Canada.



To date, we have received feedback indicating that the PERT calculator informed patients about the correct dosing of PERT, many of whom were under-dosing and not receiving the benefits of PERT. Since launched, over 800 patients to date have used the PERT Calculator.

### **RESEARCH**

For the first time, Craig's Cause Pancreatic Cancer Society created its own branded research grant awards, which were announced at the National Pancreas Conference in November 2023. These awards included:

- Two poster board presentations in the amount of \$750
- Two junior researcher research awards of \$7,500
- Two senior faculty research awards of \$75,000







It should be noted that Craig's Cause Pancreatic Cancer Society remains committed to ensuring that research funding is impactful not only in the major cities of Canada but also in smaller provinces and institutions.
