NSW INTEGRATED BIRTH CERTIFICATE



WHAT IS IT?

At the end of 2020, a legislative amendment was passed in the NSW Parliament that introduced a new Integrated Birth Certificate (IBC).

This new form of birth certificate includes information about an adopted person's birth family and adoptive family into one legal document. Both birth certificates can be used for legal identification purposes.

WHO CAN GET ONE?

The Integrated Birth Certificate is available retrospectively, which means an adopted person, or their family members who are entitled can apply for an IBC for adoptions registered in NSW.

HOW TO GET ONE?

There are different processes to obtain an IBC that depends on whether your adoption was registered before or after 2010.

For individuals adopted on or after 2010 an application to obtain an Integrated Birth Certificate can be submitted through the NSW Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages.

For adoptions registered before
1 January 2010, you need to
have previously obtained your
'Supply Authority' or 'Original
Birth Certificate' or 'Adoption
Information Certificate' from the
Adoption Information Unit
at the Department of
Communities and Justice.

A copy of one of these documents must be provided to the NSW Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages when applying for an IBC.

IS THERE A COST?

There is no cost to obtain your Integrated Birth Certificate so long as a copy of the original post-adoptive birth certificate is provided in your application.

The IBC will not provide any new or additional information.
