INTRODUCTION

In every other religion in the world, God exercises mercy at the expense of judgement, except for Christianity – where God is perfect in his justice and in his love. How? - 2. What does it mean to you to be a son or daughter of God? How does this identity impact how you live your life?
- 3. Is it easy or difficult to address God as "Abba?" Why or why not? What would it look like for you to consistently develop an "Abba-type" relationship with God?
- 4. How does fear tend to creep in with regards to your relationship with God? How can you trade that fear for the hope we have through the Christmas story?
