

Part 2: The Purpose of Prayer

INTRODUCTION

But when God doesn't do what we want Him to do, it can cause a lot of confusion. If we let that inform us about who God is and His love for us, does that mean He doesn't really care or love us? Is there a different way to approach God so that we don't put God's character on the line when we pray?

- 5. Have you ever experienced being on the other side of an unanswered prayer and seen how God worked out things, even if they weren't in the way you wanted them to originally?
