Letter from the Vestry

As we enter Fall, 2021, the vestry continued its study of Love is the Way by Bishop Michael Curry. Rev. Sarah and the Vestry see this activity as a means to both build team work and also incorporate insights into our collective plan for St. Patrick's. If you haven't read it, add it to your library.

A key item we continue to monitor are developments concerning the Hammel Condominium. As has been reported, St. Patrick's received the Deed on September 3 and the county recorded our ownership about 2 weeks later. So its ours!Since September 6, we've donated all clothing and household items to charity and removed all unusable items.

We have completed ALL interior refurbishing including new paint, new carpet, reconditioned tile and grout, re-wired some wall sockets, replaced light fixtures, added new levelor window coverings, and generally spruced up the condominium. We will be consulting with real estate professionals to determine an appropriate sale price. As you may remember, we've decided to do a For Sale by Owner (FSBO) so word of mouth is important. If you know of anyone interested in purchasing a move-in ready condominium, let the church know!

As Fall arrives, we began our stewardship season. Parishioners have been identified to speak at each service through November on our theme of Love Binds Us Together. Given all that has transpired over the past year and the themes of Bishop Curry's book, it seemed totally fitting for our current season.

Finally, we look forward to identifying a slate of vestry members to serve starting in 2022. Service on the Vestry is an important link connecting the activities in the church with one's own interests and abilities.

Warden Report

With an eye on fire prevention, the Flannel Team worked to remove literally hundreds of manzanita bushes from the campus. Emphasis was placed on lowering the density of manzanitas surrounding the outdoor chapel and opening up additional space near the IVNS nursery school playground. Work was greatly facilitated by use of an electric winch provided by a parishioner that literally allowed us to remove the bushes roots and all! We have also contacted NLFD to test our hydrant for water pressure. Figured testing peroidcally might be a good thing!

We've begun "wintering" the campus. Landscape water has been shut off at the main. The Upper deck umbrellas have been removed – although we will keep 4 heaters and some tables available for use as weather allows.

Even the newly re-installed St. Patrick's Icon, located at the entrance to the outdoor chapel and labyrinth, got a coat of penetrating stain!

Thank you to everyone who supports these initiatives to strengthen our community!
















A new cookbook by Lou McNerney!


