

Sermon The Rev. Marla Asson

Creed (adapted from Iona Abbey, Scotland):

We believe in God above us. maker and sustainer of all life, of sun and moon, of water and earth, of male and female, of both, and neither, and everything in between. We believe in God beside us. We believe in God within us. the Holy Spirit burning with Pentecostal fire,

life-giving breath of the Church, Spirit of healing and forgiveness, source of all resurrection and of eternal life. Amen.

May the leaders of this land and of the nations of the world strive for justice and peace for all of humanity. We hold close to our hearts the people of Japan, Ukraine, Israel, and Palestine.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen.*
