Duties & Responsibilities

- Attend regular meetings as set forth by the Local Coordinator or Fundraising Coordinator of the Chapter
- Help raise awareness about the charity and its work at local and national levels
- Work with the Local Chapter Coordinator/Fundraising Coordinator to help implement fundraising initiatives for chapter supported initiatives (events/grants/corporate/individual donors, etc.)
- Aid with fundraising logistics such as setting up and taking down displays at local businesses,
 gathering/distributing fundraising materials in the community, gathering and distributing fundraising/auction
 items, assisting with auction details, communicating with local businesses on fundraising initiatives, aiding in
 setup/take down of in person fundraising events and the various logistics of events such as registrations,
 decoration, food, appreciation, etc.

- Ability to work independently as well as in a team environment
- Strong interpersonal skills and are flexible and outgoing
