


1 Have students bring in a book, magazine, or picture showing an animal's home/habitat. Discuss the fact that a habitat is a place that provides shelter, which is necessary for survival, and discuss what would happen if an animal's home is destroyed. 2 Break class into small groups and complete **Activity 1: Mind Mapping** followed by **Activity 2: Discuss and Reflect.** Instructor should follow up this lesson with **Introduction to Homelessness**, part 2.

Topic: Introduction to Homelessness

Materials Needed:

- Pencils/Markers
- SBP Mind Map (included)

Instructions:

- 1 Begin the activity by putting learners into pairs or groups of 3-4.
- 2 Print and hand out a copy of the SBP mind mapping template worksheet to each pair/group
- 3 Using the mind map , have each pair/group brainstorm words associated with the words HOME and HOMELESS
- 4 Follow up activity with discussion questions 1-3
- 5. Evaluation Rubric(s): Critical thinking skills, Collaboration skills.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What does HOME mean to you?
- 2. What do you need in order to "feel at home"?
- 3. What does it mean to be homeless?



DEFINITIONS

Homelessness

Being homeless means not having a stable or safe place to live. Homelessness can include:

- Couch surfing
- Sleeping outside
- Living or sleeping in a car
- Staying in a shelter, hostel or refuge
- Living in an abandoned house or building
- Staying in overcrowded housing
- Living in temporary accommodation

Being homeless means not having a stable place to live, not feeling safe, not having privacy and not having control over your living arrangements.
