Immunisation checklist

- School aged students may attend any sessions to access vaccinations through the school immunisation program.
- Bring the Child Health Record Book and your Medicare card.
- Dress your child in comfortable clothing, with easy access to arms and legs.
- It is not necessary to give paracetamol before a vaccine.
- Bring your child's favourite toy - it may help put them at ease.
- Babies can be fed immediately after vaccination; this often helps settle them.
- Wait a full 15 minutes at the venue after the vaccination to allow your child to be observed for any possible reactions.
- There is no charge for vaccinations administered on the Australian Standard Vaccination Schedule.
