# VALE JAMES (JIM) DONALDSON HALL


Jim was the son of George and Jean Hall.

George and his family came to Lancefield in 1915 and purchased the Universal Provider in High Street (now Connolly Real estate and Field Store) from Mr. Nice.

The family lived in Lancefield for many years. Jim's eldest brother Tom died in Malaysia during WW2.

Jim played football for the Lancefield Tigers and played in a few Grand Finals. He also played cricket, a game he loved, with for Lancefield Team. He joined the staff at the State Savings Bank of Victoria at Lancefield and rose to manager at a branch in the City. When he retired Jim and his wife Mary returned to the area and built a home in the Cobaws, later moving into town.

Jim was an early member and great supporter of the Romsey Lancefield & Districts Historical Society where he held the position of treasurer for many years. Jim often mowed the grass at the Courthouse in Lancefield and he was instrumental in gaining support from the Shire to assist where possible with the Society's Historic Seymour Cottage in Romsey.







# WORKS BEGIN ON MELBOURNE-LANCEFIELD ROAD SAFETY BOOST

Work is underway on the \$20 million upgrade of Melbourne-Lancefield Road between Sunbury and Lancefield, to reduce the risk of head-on and run-off-road crashes. Flexible centreline safety barriers will be installed to reduce the risk of head-on crashes, while lefthand side flexible safety barriers will protect drivers from run-off-road crashes.

Regular breaks will be provided in the flexible barriers at appropriate locations for local traffic, and to ensure safe access for residents and emergency services. Other safety improvements include extra overtaking opportunities, including four new overtaking lanes, to enable motorists to pass safely. The road shoulder will also be widened and sealed to improve safety, while audio tactile lines will also be installed along the full length of the road, to alert drivers if they stray from their lane.

Between July 2010 and June 2015, two people lost their lives and 24 others were seriously injured in crashes on this stretch of road. Stage one works from north of Monegeetta to the south of Lancefield are expected to be complete by the end of July 2018, while the second stage of works, from north of Sunbury to Monegeetta, are scheduled to begin mid-2018.

Uncovered! The secret romance of two of Australia's most famous faces is being unveiled in the Macedon Ranges.

For decades Australians have fleetingly looked at the faces of two literary giants when handing over a ten dollar note, never realising that Henry Lawson and Mary Gilmore, "the faces on the money" had shared a love that was kept hidden from the public.

Details of the romance did not come to light until writer Anne Brooksbank, researching a biography of Dame Mary Gilmore, uncovered actual letters between the two which revealed for the first time the extraordinary relationship and the dramatic betrayal that emerged.

All My Love is a play that uses excepts from the surviving letters the audience discovers their story in the words from two of the greatest names in Australian literature.

The show will be staged at Kyneton Town Hall on Wednesday March 28th at 11am and 7.30pm.

Respected actor Dion Mills, who featured in the Foxtel series Conspiracy 365 and the film Killer Elite starring Robert De Niro, brings Henry Lawson to the stage.

"I'm really excited to bring this new work about such famous faces to the Macedon Ranges. I know people from Lancefield to Kyneton and all over will see the show not as a lesson in history but a lesson in love and what threatens it" Said Mr. Mills.

"Lawson was such a famous and complex man. Funny, brilliant, a larrikin but very troubled. It is a rare privilege to be able to speak his own words when telling this true story." said Dion.

"While many of us grew up reading works like *The Loaded Dog* and his other incredible stories of the bush, few have seen the romantic side of this Aussie bloke." said Dion.

Producer Christine Harris has been touring high profile shows across Victoria for over two decades says this production brings to life a famous yet forgotten woman

"I guarantee, after seeing *All My Love*, you will never look at a ten dollar note the same way again!" said Ms. Harris.

"Mary is Australia's most famous 'unknown' woman. She replaced the man she loved on the \$10 in 1993. Mary is a celebrated writer and led campaigns for women's right to vote, pensions and for aboriginal rights said Ms Harris.

Kim Denman, from *Neighbours*, *Blue Heelers* and *Romper Stomper* plays Mary Gilmore.

"Mary was a trailblazer, an important literary and political figure who dedicated her life to fighting against injustice and inequality." said Kim

Gilmore and Lawson were two of the most famous people in the country, yet remarkably they managed to keep their relationship secret. But more in keeping with a Jackie Collins novel, their fairytale suffered an extraordinary plot twist, again something the public never knew until now.

Already both Denman and Mills have received rave reviews for their performance in this production, which has been touring Australia. The show is produced by HIT Productions and is directed by award winner Denny Lawrence.

### **BEEN A BUSY TIME**

It has been a busy time for the Landcare group with onground work and strategic planning in a range of areas to help enhance and protect our local biodiversity.

What is biodiversity? Biological diversity refers to the variety of species of animals, plants and micro-organisms and their ecosystems in which they live and interact. This is a major part of what Landcare strives to protect and enhance.

With this in mind we are currently contributing to the Macedon Ranges Shire Council Biodiversity strategy which aims to identify policy and planning initiatives and priorities for on ground action and monitoring change in our unique and diverse environment.

We have also had some dedicated Landcare members who have been training with Melbourne Water to monitor the health of the Deep Creek through their Water Watch program with some pleasing results. Elements such as water turbidity, salinity, temperature and general water quality are being assessed on regular intervals. Deep Creek is home to the endangered Yarra Pigmy Perch which is often found in our local area, so the health of the creek is paramount to the success of this species.

We have also been working with the Rivers of the West Campaign which has been launched by the Environmental Justice Australia which seeks to gain greater legal protections for the Maribyrnong and Werribee catchments. Increases in

urban development and land clearing are two of the many threats to these vital waterways. Our local Deep Creek is one of the upper reaches of the Maribyrnong and is an important component of the catchment and well worthy of protection.





### THE FORK IN THE ROAD

Tom and I were driving along a bush road recently when we came to a fork in the road, no signs, leaving us undecided as to which way to go. Left or right? # BORE WATER ADDED

Bore water has been reintroduced to the Lancefield drinking water supply, after a decline in water levels in local reservoirs. Up to 30% bore water has been added to the town's water supply since early February, to help preserve reservoir levels and ensure there is enough water for the town over the coming months. Western Water has added bore water to Lancefield's water supply during dry times for many years. It is a standard approach designed to make the most of local water supplies. Customers are not likely to notice a change in the taste or smell of their water, as the percentage of bore water will be relatively low. All drinking water is filtered and treated at the Lancefield water filtration plant to meet Australian Drinking Water Guidelines before it is piped to customers. If the dry weather continues, water can also be made available to the town from Western Water's broader supply network through the Romsey-Lancefield pipeline. Western Water will continue to monitor reservoir levels and water usage in Lancefield, and adjust the supply system as needed.





# THIS EASTER CONSIDER THE IMPORTANCE OF THE CROSS

We will all eventually die. If the Bible is correct, there is an afterlife with judgement, heaven and hell. What is our plan to reach heaven? Many say: 'Well, I'm a relatively good person – when I die I'll just hope for the best. Others add: 'I've been baptised, had communion, plus I give regularly to the church and charities – I think I've ticked all the boxes.'

It's ironic that many people, including many Christians, think getting to heaven depends on what they do. When asked about the relevance of Jesus Christ and the Cross, most scratch their heads; they don't see a connection between their going to heaven and what Christ did on the Cross. Many people consider the cross simply a symbol of Christianity – a story told at Easter how a good man was wrongly crucified and miraculously rose from the dead.

Fact is, if we could earn our way to heaven by good deeds or religious rituals, Christ died needlessly on the Cross. If we could save ourselves by our works, there would be no point for Jesus to die for our salvation (John 3:16).

The Bible states: we can never be good enough to save ourselves (Eph. 2:8-9) – our works are filthy rags in God's sight (Isaiah 64:6) – that we need to be born-again (John 3:3) – and become a new creation in Christ (2 Cor. 5:17).

To enter the kingdom of heaven we need to have God's perfect righteousness. This is the whole point of Jesus being crucified on our behalf. If we accept the gift of salvation by believing in Christ we receive His perfect righteousness and are instantly adopted into the family of God. Alternately, if we are hoping our good deeds or religious rituals will save us; sadly, we are in for a very rude shock. We need the Cross. Christ is our salvation – He is the only door and way into heaven. Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." John 14:6. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and



that not of yourselves; it is a gift of God not of works, lest anyone should boast." Ephesians 2:8-9.




