## LANCEFIELD SHELL SERVICE STATION NOW HAS A **DEFIB**

The Romsey-Lancefield & District Ambulance Auxiliary combined with the Romsey/Lancefield Lions Club, the Bendigo Bank Romsey branch and the Romsey-Lancefield Probus club have raised and donated funds to purchase two Automatic External Defibrillators (AED's). One AED has been given to the Romsey Caltex petrol station and the second given to the Lancefield Shell service station.

Sudden cardiac arrest does not discriminate; it affects all age groups, races and genders. When a person suffers a cardiac arrest it is critical that

000 is called

CPR is commenced immediately

Defibrillation is applied as soon as possible

Advanced medical care is implemented

This is referred to as the chain of survival and is an internationally recognised standard.

Early defibrillation is by far the most vital component I the chain of survival. Victims of cardiac arrest can be saved if a defibrillator is immediately available. For every minute following a cardiac arrest the chance of survival decreases by 10%. The earlier the person receives defibrillation the greater the chance of survival. Often emergency services cannot get to a patient inside this optimal time period. Having these AED's placed in the community has the potential to save lives.

The AED's were strategically placed in the Romsey Caltex and Lancefield Shell service stations as they are two businesses in the community which receive a high number of foot traffic. Locals are familiar with the businesses and will hopefully be aware that these AED's are situated there and are able to be used in an emergency. In addition the service stations are open early in the morning and don't close until late in the evening. The AED's are very easy to use with voice prompts that guide the user through every step. Staff will be receiving training on how to use the defibrillators in an emergency.

The Romsey-Lancefield & District Ambulance Auxiliary is a small, dedicated group who raise funds to support the local ambulance station. We meet every 3 months on a Tuesday at 7.30pm at the Romsey Sporting clubrooms. Dates for this year are: May 17th, 16th August and 15th November.

## COMMUNITY HAS SAY ON \$800,000 LANCEFIELD PARK UPGRADE

The initial stages of a community consultation on an \$800,000 upgrade for Lancefield Park has attracted a range of ideas from locals and user groups keen to have their say on how the money can be invested.

Ideas generated by park user groups at a workshop coordinated by the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning on Thursday 21st April were presented to the community for feedback at a consultation at the Mechanics Institute on Saturday 30th April.

"We made a promise to give the community the opportunity to be involved in early planning for the Lancefield Park upgrade as part of the recovery work following the Lancefield-Cobaw fire last October," Labor Member for Macedon, Mary-Anne Thomas MP said.

"Having community and park user groups involved in early discussions is important to ensure the community gets maximum value for the investment and serve the needs of locals and community groups for years to come.

"With a range of ideas now on the table and community feedback on those ideas, the next steps will be to bring together a reference group of park users and representatives from DELWP to come up with some concrete proposals.

"Engaging the community and achieving the best outcomes are key to the success of this project for the Lancefield community," Ms Thomas said.


The \$800,000 grant is part of a \$1.4 million investment announced by Premier Daniel Andrews when he visited Lancefield in December last year. \$450,000 will go towards netball change room upgrades at Lancefield Park and \$150,000 will fund new toilets at the Mechanics Institute Hall.

### MEGA-PROGRESS FOR MEGAFAUNA SITE AND FESTIVAL

In a further development from last year's successful megafauna festival, new signage has been installed near the megafauna site in Lancefield Park. The signs tell a brief history of the site, and explain how the bones of thousands of prehistoric marsupial giants may have accumulated near what is likely to have once been a waterhole. More news on Lancefield is expected during the month of June, when two scientific reports, one about Lancefield megafauna and one about last year's Extinct! festival, are due to be published.

In the meantime, planning for this year's megafauna festival has been progressing well. This year, the megafauna festival will coincide with the November Farmers Market in Lancefield and will be held 25-26 November 2016. The organising committee is still calling for 2-3 volunteers to come forward who want to help shape an excitement-packed programme of music, art, talks and, of course, digging. The pleasing part of the weather picture was the very good rainfall – almost 100 mm in some areas - in the first 10 days of May. This combined with reasonably mild temperatures considerably improved pasture growth prospects. Offsetting this however in recent days there has been a few really cold nights and mornings warning us to get ready for the winter period.




## LIGHT UP THE ROAD

Op Shop funds have just purchased another defibrillator which will be housed at Karinya. In an emergency other defibs bought by the Op Shop can be found at The Townhouse, the Primary Schools, the Laurie Green Pavilion, the Mens Shed and at all the sports clubs. Defibrillators can be grabbed when you suspect someone is having a heart attack. Training on the machine gives you more confidence but anyone can use one – once you open the lid the machine will give you step by step instructions.

An ongoing service also funded by the Op Shop is advanced driving courses for anyone who has just got their licence, who lives in the 3435 postcode area. We have had great feedback from people who have done this course, even from those pushed into it by parents who were not happy about doing it in the first place. To find out more phone the House on 5429 1214.

Funds raised at the Op Shop are for projects which benefit the wider community. We hope that there will be some exciting projects that come out of the Community Consultation to contribute to in the future. ### LANCEFIELD TOPPED UP WITH MELBOURNE SUPPLY

Lancefield water supplemented with Melbourne supply

Lancefield residents may start receiving a small amount of drinking water from Melbourne this month, as Western Water plans to top up the local supply system.

The majority of the town's drinking water will still come from local water storages Garden Hut Reservoir - which is now around 37 per cent full – and the Lancefield bore.

This supply system is also connected to the wider Macedon Ranges network, via the Lancefield-Romsey pipeline.

The Macedon Ranges network is usually supplied by Gisborne's Rosslynne Reservoir, but is also connected to the Melbourne water grid.

This allows Western Water to top up water supplies during times of drought or high water use such as hot summers or during fires.

The Macedon Ranges supply network is being switched to the Melbourne supply this month, as Rosslynne has dropped to around 16 per cent of capacity.

This means some water from the Melbourne supply system may enter the Lancefield supply.

All drinking water supplied by Western Water is treated to meet the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines and is safe and healthy to drink.

Bureau of Meteorology figures show rainfall for the past six months has been very much below average for the region.

Summer 2015-16 was Victoria's third hottest on record, and autumn has also been warmer than average.

Western Water will continue to monitor reservoir levels and water usage in the region, and adjust the supply system as needed in future.

I am really happy to see that the Neighbourhood Houses in both towns have such a strong presence and impact.

Although not 'Church' initiated organisations, these groups and others are exactly what 'church' is all about and it is great for me to see so many of our parishioners involved. That extends, of course, to their involvement in the CFA and in the local sporting organisations, the Men's Shed, the Op Shop at Lancefield and in probably many others groups and activities that I haven't yet encountered.



Why control rabbits. 4 main reasons

Economic: rabbits are prodigious eaters that destroy pastures and crops as well as spread weeds.

Environmental: rabbits out compete native fauna for habitat and food and as rabbits graze selectively reduce species diversity.

Social: rabbits don't use boundaries so they are everyone's problem.

Legal: There is a legal obligation under The Catchment and Land Protection Act for a landowner to control rabbits. Failure to do so may result in significant fines.





## HELP PREVENT ELDER ABUSE

Macedon Ranges Shire Council is raising awareness of elder abuse in the lead up to World Elder Abuse Awareness Day on 15 June. Elder abuse is any act which causes harm to an older person and is generally carried out by someone they know and trust such as family or friends.

Mayor, Cr Graham Hackett said the day was a chance to remember that human rights don't diminish as people get older.

"Everyone has the right to live with dignity and respect, irrespective of their age," Cr Hackett said.

"Abuse of any sort is not okay. Council aims to build a strong community where people feel safe and secure. A big part of that is raising awareness about how and where to get support for people who need it.

"As a community we all need to take responsibility for the abuse of older adults and not just ignore it when the situation arises. Once the matter is confronted and action taken, then the process of healing can commence."

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day aims to promote understanding of the issue, with events held across the world to raise awareness of elder abuse, and highlight ways to challenge it.

"Abuse of older people is a complex problem and every situation is unique," Cr Hackett said. "Many elderly people who experience abuse find it difficult to report or are uncertain where to go for assistance.

"Staying connected with family, friends and neighbours and attending community organisations can really assist elderly people to feel and to be safe."

Elder abuse can take on many forms, including financial, physical, neglect, sexual, psychological, emotional, verbal, social, and cultural.

### PASTOR'S PARABLES

Gambling is a chancy venture where something is risked on an unknown outcome. On any uncertainty you can bet small or you can bet large - but would you be willing to bet your life on one toss of a coin or roll of a dice? Most would not be so foolish.

Those who don't believe in God are betting 'everything' on when they die there is 'nothing' and they will simply cease to exist.

But, what if death isn't the exit door to existence?

What if we have a soul that doesn't die and continues into eternity?

What if there is a meaning to life?

The truth is no one can physically prove God exists but, equally, no one can prove He doesn't. The more scientists learn about the universe and existence, the more questions arise. Ever-changing theories of evolution are based on either missing or debatable evidence. These theories imply that in the beginning there was nothing – the 'nothing' exploded and, with random precision, gradually created everything.





If you are wondering how we might be able to support you or how our group might be of benefit to someone you know who has lost a loved one to suicide - we encourage all to attend this session.


