

Early in November 2015 a fuel-reduction burn near Benloch broke containment lines to burn some 3,000 ha of public and private land, destroying homes, buildings, fences, stock and wildlife. Benloch is a mystical place. People know it exists but only residents know its whereabouts! Officially the fire is identified as 'The Lancefield Fire'. Many were traumatised. Others responded to assist those impacted, including the Benloch brigade, organisations such as churches, the Red Cross, neighbourhood houses from various communities as well as emergency-service personnel and governments (federal, state and local).

This story is just one about that fire.

In December, a Christmas celebration was organised for the brigade and the local community at the Benloch Fire Station, the tin shed that acts as the CBD of Benloch. It was planned and run by the brigade but supported by many organisations and individuals. The scheduled program included a talk about fire safety, a learned explanation from an expert about trauma and the impacts on individuals, live music, a visit by Santa in the fire truck followed by a spit roast for dinner, all concluded by a movie under the stars. The kids had a play area so that grown-ups could get information without being worried about children being further upset by the delivery of objective data. In addition, everybody could have the chance to share stories about their experiences. The presence of professionals to help people to recover was a bonus.

The fire was frightening for fire-fighters as well as the community. The CFA has a volunteer peer-support group to help brigade members and their families cope with trauma during and after any incident and they were active here. The Macedon Ranges Shire organised a committee to co-ordinate the recovery which included a brigade member and a CFA peer. Good-on you, Macedon Ranges.

Others became involved, some by indirect association. Norm Bowen, CFA's Peer Co-ordinator for north-west Victoria had heard about the activities of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Rochester Fire Brigade who had raised money to help CFA brigade members and their families in the north-west. They are located near the Murray River, many miles from Benloch. The thrust of this effort was focused on the weather. It looked as if a significant drought was about to affect farmers and they feared that many families may need welfare assistance in the near future. They were planning to provide hampers when food was lacking. This same situation had occurred in previous droughts and floods and they were determined to be prepared.

While the lack of rain was (and still is) causing hardship, the extent and depth of anticipated difficulties were not as severe as originally anticipated. As a result, Norm thought that perhaps some of the funds could be re-directed to assist others currently in need, such as those affected by the Lancefield fire. As it turned out, hampers for families were

already provided, but the welfare of kids was identified as a special need.

The Benloch Brigade had planned for Santa to attend and give kids some lollies and colouring-in-books and crayons. But with this extra funding, perhaps Santa could be made more relevant, especially for older kids who may be past the colouring-in stage but still deserving of recognition. The Rochester ladies were approached who were enthusiastic and personally delivered a very large sack of Santa presents to suit a variety of kids.

Get back to reality. What was originally planned as an event for 100 people soon grew to 170. What's more, the Christmas celebration had hic-cups. Hey - this was a big project for a rural brigade to plan, organise and run. The caterers surprise, surprise got lost and were late. Many areas of unburnt bushland within the fire-controlled area continued to flare up from time to time and the Benloch brigade responded. Unfortunately one of these occurred on the day of the party so that the brigade was busy tackling an outbreak, a peat fire which takes ages to control.

Although the brigade was late to the Christmas party,


Santa did arrive. He guided the kids to a screened area where each selected a present from a big pile. Parents subsequently said that the kids were very excited with Santa and the presents as well as the opportunity to throw themselves around in the jumping castle and play the games on offer. And the families there had a great time. Benloch brigade deserves accolades

The delays to the program meant that both the Rochester representatives and the attending peer had other priorities and could not stay long enough to experience their anticipated reward: the looks on the kids' faces when Santa gave the presents. However, their contributions were publicly acknowledged (the bush-equivalent of a standing ovation, I'm told). The brigade subsequently told them that they had positively contributed to assist the community to recover.

Thinking that you have done something worth-while is wonderful. Having somebody thank you is the icing on the Christmas cake. But to know you have caused kids to smile at Christmas transports you to that magical place where a reindeer has a red and very shiny nose.

WHAT'S THE HOUSE

There are still a lot of people who don't know what the Neighbourhood House is all about so we thought we would start off the year with a refresher.

Lancefield Neighbourhood House is run by a volunteer committee of management - people from the community who are interested in making Lancefield a great place to live. The Committee receive some funding from the State government so they can employ a coordinator for 20 hours a week. Other funding for projects comes from grants, including an annual amount of just over \$3000 from the

The Neighbourhood House hopes to provide options that will change that so we can have a strong, connected community where people care for each other, are healthier and enjoy being part of life in Lancefield. We are open to any suggestions you may have.

2016 will be a busy year with us continuing to work on sustainability and domestic violence projects with the rest

of the Neighbourhood Houses in the Macedon Ranges Shire. We will also be launching the Lancefield website and the Lancefield Stories page - more details will be in the next Mercury.

To start off the year with plenty of energy we will be running an Adrenal Fatigue Syndrome workshop. Many of us will discover that a lot of symptoms we have are a result of this syndrome but the exercise you will learn in the workshop strengthen your adrenal system. SERVING LOCAL PEOPLE WITH LOCAL HISTORY

The Romsey Lancefield & Districts begins 2016 with new president Noreen, and some old and some new office bearers. We would like to thank all previous committee members, especially Robyn for all the work she has put in at the Courthouse for many years helping everyone who has been researching their family tree.

Our volunteers are looking forward to continuing to serve the local people with local history. The courthouse is open Monday, Wednesday and Friday 10am till 2pm or by appointment. Membership is \$20 single or \$30 couple.

Following the recent Megafauna festival the collection of bones which were on display during the celebrations will be housed at the Lancefield Courthouse.

WEATHER COMMENT

NOT MUCH HAS CHANGED

I probably wrote this last year if not in other years but two months seem to have flown and it is time to start another round of weather comments. Not much has changed, the dry conditions are affecting both gardens and farms. Rainfall a total of 96mm for the two months has been very patchy with one good fall of 31mm around Christmas which was the heaviest individual fall for all of 2015. We sold the last of our ewes at Kyneton Special sale last Friday and that leaves only the bulk of last year's lambs to sell. The agents reported that the early pens sold well but after that it was hard work to get good prices for the rest. The cattle markets, reading from the rural press, are still strong and as we are now in the season of calf [weaner] sales it will give an indication of things to come.

Toby is back on sheep pellets and never fails to call out when he hears some movement around the house.

The gardens are showing the effects of the dry season although some of the flowers inn particular the roses, are still quite colourful. SUMMER FIRE SAFETY

As the holiday period ends and everyone settles back into their normal weekly routines, Council would like to remind residents that February is the time of greatest fire risk in our shire and it's important to have a plan and to know what to do in the event of an emergency such as a bushfire.

BUSHFIRE SURVIVAL PLAN

Understanding your level of risk is the first step in developing your Bushfire Survival Plan. Research shows that when threatened by a fire, many people living in high risk areas will leave it too late to make critical decisions, leaving them with very few safe options.

WHERE WILL YOU GO?

It's important to identify where you will go on high fire risk days e.g. to family or friends, in Melbourne or elsewhere. Remember, in high-risk areas, leaving early the safest option.

Neighbourhood Safer Places-Places of Last Resort should not be your 'go-to' place when you decide to enact your fire plan. These places are a 'last resort' option when all your plans have failed.

They are not staffed, may not have electricity or other services, and there is no guarantee that the CFA or other agencies will be able to defend the building if it is threatened by fire.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

If an emergency such as a bushfire occurs and you need to leave your home, Council will open an Emergency Relief Centre. This centre is located well away from the affected area and the location will be broadcast on radio, social media and online, www.emergency.vic.gov.au

Food and water

Personal support

Temporary accommodation

Information

A place to bring your pets (make sure you bring a leash or cage, food, water bowls and anything else they may need).

CODE RED FIRE DANGER DAYS

Garbage, recycling and green bins will not be collected on Code Red days. If your collection falls on one of these days, your bins will be collected the following day, or as soon as possible after the Code Red day-even on weekends.

In Woodend, Macedon and Mt Macedon all Council services and facilities will be closed on Code Red Fire danger
