



My thanks are not confined to our Brigade members alone but to all those who came from far and wide and including the air wing along with other personnel who worked hard and long to achieve the outcome we did. It was unfortunate that people lost houses and other items of considerable value and we send our commiserations to them. It was certainly an anxious time for the area and it gave a trial run for the support groups in our area - well done! It has been many years since areas of the Cobaws have had a fire of this magnitude and consequently the fuel load was heavy and with difficult terrain it took a lot of work to control it. Also my apologies for no article in the last issue of the Mercury, writing an article was low on the list of priorities at that time.

The next item is to inform the community that apart from the normal Brigade meeting a Special Brigade meeting was held to elect replacement members to positions that had become vacant and also to fill new positions which the Brigade felt would assist in Brigade management. The following members were elected 2nd

Lieutenant - S. Winks, Health and Safety Co-ordinator - J Waterman, Fire Prevention and Vegetation Management Coordinator - S. Mustey, Communication Officer - D. Smith, 2nd VFVB Delegate - S. Winks. O.O. Andy Waterson read the job outlines for the above positions to all members. Congratulations to those elected.

As a follow on to the fire, for those who have the hard task of rebuilding both houses and lives please take on board anything that could help prevent this happening again. Advice will be available from the CFA and our local Shire Council which will be a big part of the rebuilding programme. We await the outcome of the inquiry into the Cobaw fire and it is not prudent for any comment to be made at this time.

Always feel free to talk to any of our members if you have any concerns and also come to the Fire Station on a Sunday morning. The Mercury is not published in January so look for the next article in the February issue and continue to follow us on Facebook.

# IN THE AFTERMATH OF THE FIRE

The escape of the planned burn in the Cobaw forest was very scary and emotional for all of us. While the fire was out of control there were many examples of how people pull together in community to support each other and get done what needs to be done. In the aftermath of the fire it is important to continue the connections we have with each other. To know if our friend or neighbour needs help and know where we can go for assistance or to have questions answered. Shire officers continue to work with people whose lives have been affected by the recent fire and this includes referring for counselling support.

The disaster response and recovery mode that the Shire kicks into has really provided, and continues to, a one stop shop for all aspects of dealing with a fire in the region. Relief centres for people needing to leave their homes are set up in a place which is deemed the safest for people to travel to depending on the possible direction of a fire. Once it is safe to do so the Shire will move their support closer to where people live. It is important for us to learn what options are available to us during times of disaster.

There is no easy single solution as each incident is different but there are avenues of support and information

we can call on. I recommend that you visit the Shire website and become familiar with their emergency information or phone them to be sent information. (5422 0333).

# FIRE INVESTIGATION

During the fires local MP Mary-Anne Thomas asked me if I would be a community representative on the fire investigation team. I had really no idea at the time what that meant but have come out the other side having had quite an experience and knowing more about fire than I knew existed.

A few people have questioned why I was asked and my best response to that is that it wasn't just me that was asked but the whole of the Neighbourhood House and the networks we have in the community.

The House committee and volunteers worked hard to support me with the investigation and many of them also spent hours supporting the catering at the staging area, helping individuals or organising a change of clothes from the Op Shop for people who weren't able to get home. My contribution to the investigation was certainly not something I did alone.

A number of people contributed a lot of effort into organising and collating the survey which was distributed around the community as a means of gathering peoples input into the investigation. The 117 survey responses and 15 written submissions received meant that there was a strong local opinion for the investigation team to consider.

The terms of reference for the investigation were specific, aimed at learning what went wrong so planned burns don't get out of control in the future. The Minister for the Department responsible for planned burning told us, at the release of the investigation report, that they will work on all the recommendations listed in the report, that she will come back to the community with the changes they will make and that the Inspector General of Emergency Services will be an independent monitor to ensure they do what they say they are going to do.

Many of the concerns, issues and recommendations received from the community through the survey were outside the terms of reference and were compiled into a separate report. A group of people who were representative of the topics raised in this second report met with personnel from Emergency Services Victoria to discuss them in more detail and, at the time of writing this, we are reading a draft outcome of the meeting which will be the basis for a report to the community in the future.

# COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

The strength of our community was evident during and after the fires. As mentioned above it is important for us to continue with this connectedness for the benefit of both individuals and Lancefield as a whole, especially for residents in the surrounding areas which were the most affected by the fire. There are several events being organised to support the communities' recovery process - Benloch CFA will be holding their Christmas event in early December and over the next few months some fantastic arts workshops are being organised which will give us all an opportunity to add our story of who we

The Christmas Carols evening will be held in Lancefield Park on Friday 11 December at 6pm. This is a lovely relaxed evening to enjoy sitting around with friends, there is loads of free entertainment for children and an inexpensive dinner can be purchased from the Neighbourhood House BBO. The night is also a chance to thank all the amazing local CFA brigades who protect our community and there will be a presentation to them of the donations received at this year's Lancefield Show.

# PASS CYCLISTS WITH CARE CAMPAIGN

The annual Bike Safe "Pass with Care" campaign returns this summer. You will see our big campaign trailer out in the Macedon Ranges and billboards on the roads conveying a simple message that asks motorists to pass cyclists with care.

Please wait a few seconds before overtaking a cyclist until oncoming traffic has passed. If there are no double lines and when safe, move into the next lane and pass as if passing another vehicle. Cyclists ride at around 20 to 30kph so allow plenty of room when pulling in. If you drive too close, your vehicle causes a draft and can cause cyclists to crash. Since our last campaign a cyclist has been killed on our local roads and a number very seriously injured. These are avoidable tragedies. We want everyone to get home safely to their families.

# HEATWAVE HELP AT HAND

As the summer months approach, Macedon Ranges Shire Council is reminding residents to keep cool and stay hydrated during heatwaves. Council, in conjunction with five other regional Victorian councils, have developed a practical website designed to assist central Victorian residents prepare themselves and their homes to beat extreme heat.

The Heatwave Help website, which can be found online at heatwavehelp.com.au features information on:

Keeping yourself cool – drink water, dress for the weather, go somewhere cool, stay in the shade, reduce physical activity, look after your pets, go shopping before it gets too hot, call ooo when you're not feeling well

Better managing your home – homes heat up for a number of reasons and these reasons may vary according to the direction your home faces. Keep windows and blinds closed until it cools down outside, reduce drafts, zone off areas.

Improving your home – small improvements to your home can make a big difference to the temperature. Windows are one of the biggest sources of heat gain. Put external blinds on your sunniest windows, draught seal gaps and cracks and ensure there are thick curtains on windows.

Mayor, Cr Jennifer Anderson said the frequency of heatwaves in Australia are increasing, and this is cause for concern.



# WEATHER COMMENT

What a different report this month with 44mm of rain measured here. The temperatures have however been mixed, ranging between cool and hot with the need for our heater in the lounge room some evenings and other nights being uncomfortably hot, not pleasant for a good night's sleep. The pastures have slowed the rate of drying off but there was not enough rain to improve their growth to any great extent. The stock are doing well and Toby continues to thrive - we have had to erect a temporary fence to keep him off the garden fence which has been successful up to date. I am looking out the window at our cattle as they have a drink and their coats are shiny and they look very sleek. They are not scheduled for market yet. The lambs are also growing well and at this stage they are not headed for market. It remains to be seen if we get some follow up rain which could useful for those growing summer crops for feeding their animals, the lucerne at this stage is looking disappointing but another good fall of rain could change this. I have seen a great response some years ago after rain and similar lead up weather.

Late Spring in the garden and the roses are putting a great display as are the paeonies – self sown cottage garden plants add to the colour as they always do. Rhododendrons and bottle brushes have also enjoyed the weather – it's nice to be outside. The vegie plot has not received much attention, but something will happen.





# HAVE YOUR SAY: AMENDMENT C110 ON PUBLIC EXHIBITION

Macedon Ranges Shire Council is seeking comments on a new planning scheme amendment—Amendment C110 that seeks to manage rural living opportunities in the shire to 2045.

The amendment proposes changes to the Macedon Ranges Planning Scheme, including:

a reduction in minimum lot sizes for nominated land in existing Rural Living Zones around Gisborne, Gisborne South and Riddells Creek and a small area in Romsey, north of Ochiltrees Road

the introduction of Development Plan overlays that will coordinate development in line with existing features and characteristics, and provide for an integrated pedestrian, cycle and vehicle networkthe rezoning of land from the Farming Zone to the Rural Living Zone south of Kyneton, and north of Kyneton-Springhill Road.

the introduction of minimum setback controls.

Council's Director Planning and Environment, Sophie Segafredo said that the amendment proposes to implement the recommendations outlined in the In the Rural Living Zone Strategy that was recently adopted by Council. "People are attracted to this shire for both the urban and rural landscapes so it's important that the Planning Scheme provides for a range of housing and rural living opportunities in the long term, which this amendment is designed to do" she said.

The Little Veggie Patch; DIY Garden Projects by Mat Pember - RRP\$45.00

Perfect timing to get your garden organised for the upcoming holidays!

Practical projects for smallspace edible gardening and backyard fun from the much-loved Little Veggie Patch co. The book has 6 chapters - Kids, Recycled/ Upcyled, X-Factor, Vertical Gardening, Gardening basics and Kitchen. There are 38 projects, and each chapter includes a breakout 'patch favourite' feature project.

Projects range from the incredibly quick and simple, such as a selfwatering milk-carton planter, how to grow micro-herbs and milk-crate planter boxes to large-scale building projects such as making vertical gardens from pallets, creating your own hops tower for home beer brewing and how to build an ultimate cubby house from recycled apple

crates.

The book is written in the funny and approachable style associated with the Little Veggie Patch Co, with clear step-by-step instructions with fun, colourful photographs illustrating each step. This is the first Veggie Patch Co. book to be so specifically focussed on DIY projects.

#### MEMOIR:

A Mother's Story by Rosie Batty - RRP \$32.99



A profoundly moving and inspiring memoir from Australia's domestic violence crusader, Rosie Batty. Rosie Batty knows pain

no woman should have to suffer. Her son was killed by his father in a violent incident in February 2014, a horrendous event that shocked not only the nation, but the world. Greg Anderson murdered his 11-year-old son Luke and was then shot by police at the Tyabb cricket oval.

Rosie had suffered years of family violence and had intervention and custody orders in place in an effort to protect herself and her son.

She believes the killing was Greg's final act of control over her. Since the events of last February. Rosie has become an outspoken crusader against domestic violence, winning hearts and mind all over Australia with her compassion, courage, grace and forgiveness.

In the wake of the tragedy, Rosie's advocacy work has forced an unprecedented national focus on family violence, with the Victorian Labor government establishing Australia's first royal commission into family violence, and committing a further \$30 million over four years to protect women and children at high risk of family violence. The then Victorian Police Commissioner Ken Lay called it 'the Rosie Batty factor'. In January 2015, Rosie was named Australian of the Year, 2015. Inspiring, heartfelt and profoundly moving, this is Rosie's story. A percentage of royalties from sales of this book are going to the Luke Batty Foundation.

# HISTORY:

The Witches Salem, 1692 by Stacy Schiff -RRP \$32.99

It began in 1692, over an exceptionally raw Massachusetts winter, when a minister's daughter started to scream and convulse. It ended less than a year later, but not before nineteen men and women had been hanged and an elderly man crushed to death. The panic spread quickly, involving the most educated men and prominent politicians in the colony. Neighbours accused neighbours, parents accused children, husbands accused wives, children accused their parents, and siblings each

other.

Vividly capturing the dark, unsettled atmosphere of seventeenth-century America, Stacy Schiff's magisterial history draws us into this anxious time. 




# YEAR 3/4 CAMP

#### CONFIRMATION



# COMMEMORATIVE CENTENARY POPPIES



Mr Ron Davis of Trentham was invited to attend a meeting with members of the Romsey-Lancefield RSL on 6
November. Ms Mary-Anne Thomas MP was also invited as a guest, to attend the presentation of a lead based enamelled poppy to the RSL.

Ms Thomas presented the red enamelled poppy in its wooden frame, on behalf of Mr Davis to the RSL president Mr Reinhard Goschiniak and in turn Mr Davis presented a cheque for \$300 to the RSL.

Mr Davis has collected thousands of British-issue .303 calibre bullets found near Bald Hill at an an old rifle range dating back to 1906, where cadets learnt to handle guns and was aware that many of these men would eventually have

gone on to serve in WWW1.

Mr Davis has recycled these old bullets by melting down the lead contained in the bullets and then ingeniously turning them into commemorative poppies to coincide with this Gallipoli Centenary as a tribute to the ANZACS.

He has sold over 180 poppies and with each one of these sales he has generously donated \$20, to Legacy and various other RSL branches.

His aim is to bring poppy No 303 to Canberra and to have it displayed at the Australian War Museum. It was agreed at the presentation to support Mr Davis in his plan to donate this last poppy to the museum.
