

Always Interesting and Often Surprising Enquiries



Romsey Railway Station circa 1900

We are often surprised at the enquiries we receive each month, the main ones are about the railways, particularly the Lancefield to Kilmore line and Burke & Wills. It will be 57 years in August since the trains to Lancefield stopped running. At the moment we are on the lookout for a photo of the Lancefield Milk Bar/News agency from sometime in the last 50 years. This photo could be added to our current project that is the history of the businesses in Lancefield, there are similar projects for Romsey, Riddells Creek and Rochford.

Last week we had a visit from Kevin Smith from Western Australia and he had brought with him 12 members of his family to see where their ancestors had lived and worked in Romsey. Their grandfather David Smith had a fruit and vegetable & tobacconist on the East side of Main Street and then he moved across the street and the business expanded to a news agency as well. David Smith and family came to Romsey in 1894 and left in 1910 to go to the West. Bert Smith, son of David joined the army and went to the first war and was killed in action. Kevin and 2 members of his family visited us late last year and we were able to find quite a few pieces of information about his family during their time in Romsey.





Vanessa's garden

At this time of year you can be both putting your garden to bed and planning garden improvements to do over the winter ready for spring.

Autumn Pest Control

In the putting to bed category are essential seasonal jobs like pruning, which I've written about in previous columns. Another essential job is pest control. If you tackle them early there will be less of a problem during the growing season and now is the time to get your revenge on the dratted white cabbage butterfly. The eggs will have been laid by the time you read this and could already have hatched into caterpillars which may be furtively munching on your winter crops even as you read. These caterpillars laugh at frosts so it's no good hoping Mother Nature will take care of them for you because she won't. If you prefer not to use chemicals you can do as I do and spray with weak salty water. Start with 2 teaspoons of salt to a bucket of water. Spray directly on to the pests and if it's strong enough they will roll off. If they don't, add another teaspoon until you get a mix that works.



Garden Improvements

I have several projects on my burgeoning to do list but as ever, it's a question of time and money. The wish list starts with a greenhouse or polytunnel, so that I can start seedlings off early and protect tender pot plants from the frosts. I also need to fence or start a hedge around my orchard, as you can see from the picture below of a wallaby helping himself to fresh apple shoots after the recent rain.



Making New Beds

I also want to build some new garden beds this winter. There's a long sunny stretch by the dog pen and our farm shed that's reasonably well sheltered from wind and frost and it's an ideal place for a splash of native colour. I want to attract more birds, so the main planting will include a couple of bottle-brushes, some grevilleas and banksias. Because this bed will largely be devoted to natives, the focus will be on removing the grass and perennial weeds and I'll confine improvements to making sure the soil is slightly acid. I'll test the soil

once the weeds are out to make sure it hasn't been contaminated by previous construction work and if all is well, a scant helping of blood and bone should be all the beds need. Planting now means that winter rains (fingers crossed) and cooler weather should enable the plants to form good root systems in time for spring. I also won't be staking, I want them to rock a little to encourage a sturdy habit, rather than relying on external support. Fierce southerlies blast up our little valley and the plants need to be strong enough to



cope without relying on a stake which might get uprooted. I will be watering but not to excess. Just enough to help them get established.

Winter Weed Work

Removing perennial weeds can be a pain as they seem to keep coming back as soon as your back is turned. One way to cope with them is to lay a thick straw mulch. Of course they'll soon poke through it but the idea is to use a garden fork to lift the mulch. The weeds (being rooted)

slide through and flop back onto the soil. You then drop the mulch back on top. It's simple and quick to do. You might have to do this more than once but after a couple of months they'll be too weak to keep going and die off to become part of the mulch. No poison, little effort and no digging! That's my kind of gardening. Other members of the family often offer to help, when they see how easy it is. Here, for example, is my Labrador Whisky, helping to suppress weeds in a newly built and mulched bed. At least that's his story.

"Encourage Church"

A teacher one day gave her pupils a lesson all about magnets. The next day she set a written test which included the question, "my name has six letters, beginning with the letter m and I pick up things what am I?" When the test papers were handed back she was astonished to find that almost 50 percent of the children answered the question with the word mother. Yes I suppose mothers do pick up things, but they do much more than just picking up clothes and toys from around the house. This is demonstrated with a true story which comes out of World War 2 and the holocaust that took the lives of millions of people – it's about Solomon Rosenberg and his family.

Solomon Rosenberg and his wife and their two sons and his mother and father were arrested and placed in a Nazi concentration camp. It was a labour camp and the rules were simple. "As long as you can do your work, you are permitted to live. When you become too weak to do your work, then you are exterminated."

Rosenberg watched his mother and father marched off to their deaths and he knew that next would be his youngest son, David, because David had always been a frail child. Every evening Rosenberg came back into



the barracks after his hours of labour and searched for the faces of his family. When he found them they would huddle together, embrace one another, and thank God for another day of life. One day Rosenberg came back and didn't see those familiar faces. He finally discovered his oldest son, Joshua, in a corner, huddled, weeping,



\$278,000 into the Melbourne - Lancefield road at Monegeeta. The funding boost is at the forefront of Victoria's new Road Safety Strategy 2013-22 and Action Plan 2013-16. This vital local project, which includes the Melbourne - Lancefield road is part of the unprecedented, decade-long boost to road safety where \$100 million will be spent on local road safety projects each year between 2013 and 2022 under a revamped Safer Road Infrastructure Program.

The Government's new strategy will drive the next decade of road safety in Victoria and outlines priority actions for government.

It includes bold new measures to further prevent deaths and injuries on our roads and cement Victoria's position as a leader in road safety through enforcement, education and innovation including:

Drink driving - expansion of the use of alcohol interlocks to the vehicles of convicted drink drivers:

Drug driving - a new offence with a tough penalty for driving under the combined influence of alcohol and illicit drugs;

Speeding - encouraging people to use technologies that alert drivers when speeding:

Distraction – a major new campaign to educate people on the dangers of driving while distracted and tougher penalties for drivers detected using a mobile

Pedestrians and cyclists – review of the use of 40km/h zones where the risk of pedestrian or cyclist crashes is high and a new 'black area' program to provide safer infrastructure where clusters of pedestrian and cyclist crashes occur;

Country road users - improvement of safety at Victoria's regional level crossings and the use of the Motorcycle Blackspot Program on popular touring

Motorcyclists - introduction of a graduated licensing system for motorcyclists; Unlicensed drivers - introduction of requirements for all Victorian drivers and riders to carry their licence when on the road;

Trucks - trial of fatigue detection technology for truck drivers and introduction of new penalties for tailgating;

Vehicle safety - trial of in-vehicle warning devices to alert drivers to approaching hazards such as trains approaching level crossings.







While water saving at home has become a habit for most Riddells Creek residents, there's another way you can help save water.


Leaks and bursts in water mains can mean the loss of thousands of litres of precious drinking water.

How To Be Successful.....

"Success is the favorable end of your effort".

Why do we like to cut down, the 'tall poppies' amongst us. We need people with vision, like Sir Franc Falkiner. Sir Henry Bolle, Paul Keating, Sir Robert Menzies, Linsey Fox, Virgin's Richard Branson and many others, that follow us. I admire Rupert Murdoch (being a tall poppy). As recent as this 4th of April, he gave Australians (he's now an American), advice on how to be successful: "Success must be fought for..... Success must be won". He is an astute businessman and certainly had to fight, for his success. When his father, Keith Murdock, died in 1952, Rupert had to continue his father's Adelaide newspapers, "News" and "The Sunday Mail". Rupert was then 21 years old. After a year apprenticeship, with the "Daily Express", in London, he returned to Australia.

In 1953, still only a boy of 23 years, he had the ambilion, to start an Australian-wide newspaper. Others in the newspaper-echelon thought, this was a 'crazy' idea and hindered him in his efforts. In 1956 he purchased, "The Sunday Times" in Perth and in 1960 "The Mirror" in Sydney. In 1965 he published the first issue, of "The Australian". It was compiled electronically and printed as an identical newspaper, in the different states of Australia. I still remember how news-agents, were compelled, NOT to sell "The Australian". Rupert being determent, then sold his papers just the same, but now through, petrol service stations. "The Australian's " deliveries were also sabotaged. So he delivered his papers, with his own "Aerocomander" aeroplane. He had to fight his way, all the way to

England, to become successful.

In 1981 he bought, for a song, the British newspaper "The Times", which was losing money and had to stop publication, because of industrial action. In 1986 he had finished building, a new electronic publishing complex at Wapping, in England and sacked 6000 employees there.

He later re-employed some of those and paid them £60 million in compensation. His tough father, Keith Murdock instilled, in his son a fighting spirit "to help create, through the Institute of Public Affairs an Australia, where man and women would rise in society, not because they were born into privilege (as Rupert was), but because they earned it, with their hard work, their thrift and their sense of enterprise". In those early years, Rupert had a high opinion of Gough Whitlam and supported him. Later he became convinced that "Adam Smith (the Scottish philosopher, 1723-1790) is a more reliable guide for a nation, than Karl Marx.

In Britain in 1980, the Murdock press supported Margaret
Thatcher. In 1997 it supported Tony Blair and in 2010 it supported
the Tories again. Rupert advocates: "To succeed one has to produce
something, that other people are willing to pay for".

He certainly produced papers, the people wanted to buy. "Australian society is fair, where opportunity is open to all, not just those at the top", he said. But he also asks: "What is fair, when some take money from people, who have earned it and then giving it to people who didn't?" I still remember when he said: "There should be as much
