- Supporting a Skate Park

Some of the projects identified are part of the Community Action Plan created by the community in 2008/9. As there is no longer a Shire Community Planning Officer the Neighbourhood House hopes to continue to progress the Plan by supporting existing projects and investigating those yet to be started.

These projects will be on top of what the Neighbourhood House currently undertakes;

Running hobby and vocational classes

Internet access, photocopying and other office services – these are now available in our Townhouse which is developing to be a place where local information and resources are available as well as being an outlet for purchasing locally produced items (and of course our massage chair)

Managing the Op Shop, Farmers Market and Mens Shed

The Op Shop will continue to pay for young people to undertake driver education when they get their licence and funds will support community projects. We are currently working with both primary schools and discussing ways we can assist through these funds.

You are welcome to join any of the House projects as a volunteer. If you are interested in being part of the dynamic committee our AGM is on the third Thursday of October each year.

Finally, but most importantly, I want to thank Michelle Balthazar for convening a very productive session. Also the Committee of Management need to be recognised for their dedication to making Lancefield a better place for us all to live. Each committee member has joined and volunteers their time for the community. A few members give an incredible amount of their time each week to sustaining the existing House projects and working on new ones.

Of course none of this could be done without all our other wonderful volunteers and the support of you, the community. We should be a very proud community.





Vanessa's garden

Autumn will be firmly upon us by the time you read this, although whether Mother Nature will pay any attention to a calendar devised by humans – who knows? At time of writing it is still hot and as promised, here is the concluding set of tips about gardening when water is scarce.

Last month I explained how to go about establishing a thriving 'low-water' garden in our area by selecting appropriate plants (I recommended plants that evolved to cope in dry Mediterranean types of climate) and by planting in autumn and early winter, rather than spring. This month I want to tell you about some other things that will help you get the most out of Mediterranean-style planting. These tips hold good for establishing suitable native plants too.

Water Gradient

You may well have some plants already in your garden with higher water requirements and you will probably want to keep some, if not all of them, depending on their water needs.

One solution is to establish a water gradient. This isn't a literal gradient, just a way of saving that it's more efficient to group plants with similar water needs near to each other for easier watering. For example it probably makes sense that plants near the house or close to your garden water source are the ones with highest water needs. As you move further away from the water source establish plants with progressively lower water needs and furthest out is the place for those plants which don't need supplementary watering (once they are established).

Shade

If there is little shade in your garden, it's worth seeing what you can do to create a bit more, as shade helps reduce evaporation and cools breezes.

You can do this quickly with shade sails and the like, but a more long term solution is to plant a tree or two, although you'll need to bear in mind the cosseting required in early years, in terms of water and feed. And while I hate to discourage anyone from planting trees, around here you do need to make sure you're not increasing your fire risk by planting a big tree in your garden.

An alternative solution, and one which might show faster results in terms of shade, is to put up a pergola or similar and train a summer climber over it.

. .

I'm sure I don't need to repeat the benefits of laying mulch in spring before the weather gets too hot.

Mulch

It can significantly reduce watering needs, as well as smothering the weeds that might otherwise steal precious food and water from the plants you actually want.

Organic mulch helps improve the soil but could be a fire risk if it dries out, so inorganic graveltype mulches might be a better option close to the house.

Of course you could use ground cover plants to do the job just as well although they will add to the water requirement.

Soil and Feeding

In tough times the strongest plants have the best chance of survival.
Give your plants

a fighting chance by attending to the structure and drainage capacity of your garden soil.

The simple way to do this is to regularly add compost and organic matter. A dose of organic fertiliser will greatly help your plants cope

> with tough conditions and a seaweed tonic helps them grow root structure.

Watering

Finally, although we are focussing on cutting water use in the garden, you'll still need to do some watering. The point is to make sure that not a drop is wasted and to understand that young plants need extra water while they establish.

Even drought tolerant plants will still need a bit of help in their second season but as long as you keep the soil healthy and feed where appropriate, they should thrive pretty much on natural rain fall thereafter (as long as we do get some rain of course).

When watering remember the rule of thumb that a deep soak once or twice a week is preferable to a splash every day as it encourages deeper rooting. Water at the base of the plant rather than wetting foliage and keep your fingers crossed for some more good soaking rain.

Weather Comment 17-3-13

Storms one week, Heat the next!

There has been no doubt about the diversity of weather that we experience in these parts. The storm that caused me to write the postscript to last month's article was followed by rain periods and more storms to give a total of 95mm which has turned the country from brown to green in a matter of days.

This was followed by a spell of hot days that continued for an unusual time and proved very hard to put up with. It was not conducive to outside work and many tasks were put on hold until things became cooler. In direct contrast is today which has an element of Winter or so it seems with misty showers and a cold South wind which has been absent for the last weeks and takes some getting used to after the heat of the previous weekend. Never satisfied, are we?

When the cool change arrived I took the opportunity to drench the ewe weaners and to put them back on the lucerne paddock which had responded to the rain and grew 150mm in two weeks and eased the feed supply situation as far as they were

concerned; also there has been some response in the rest of the paddocks.

In a perfect world some follow up rain would have been most welcome but we are thankful for what we have had and any future rain will be of value as far as pasture growth is concerned. Selling some of the cattle has also made a difference to the amount of feed available to the sheep.

The other cattle have come through the Summer in good condition so a further break in the weather should see them continuing to gain weight.

The rain revived the garden to a certain extent and some of the flowers are still blooming and it certainly looks more colourful than last month but is an in between time now as the Autumn flowers appear.

The vegetable garden revived a little but is not providing much, carrots mainly, so it is time to look to next Spring to get some fresh produce from the


The Bounceback acronym provides some simple strategies for resilience and getting along with others.



Call to help preserve Lancefield's water resources

Western Water is calling on Lancefield residents to conserve water as dry weather continues after the state's hottest summer on record.

"Lancefield may be placed on water restrictions or be switched to 100% bore water for its drinking supply if water use remains high and there is not significant rainfall soon," Western Water's Managing Director, Neil Brennan, says. Garden Hut Reservoir, which supplies Lancefield's drinking water, has dropped to around 50% of capacity, or 58 million litres, down from 100% in mid-November. During summer Lancefield residents used an average of about 20 million litres of water a month, or around 235 litres per person per day.

"All reservoirs have an amount of unusable water, known as 'dead storage', as water quality drops as the water level falls," Mr Brennan says. "It would take a couple of months of good rainfall to get Garden Hut Creek flowing again and for the reservoir to start recovering."

Lancefield received 93.4mm of rain over summer,

most of which fell in late February - around half of last summer's total of 179.7mm. Western Water began adding bore water to Lancefield's drinking supply earlier this year, and is regularly monitoring the water supply to test levels of hardness and ensure it meets all drinking water guidelines. Bore water is typically harder than reservoir water as it contains higher levels of dissolved minerals. This can reduce the effectiveness of soap and detergents, and can have an impact on some household appliances. It's a good idea to check the manufacturers' instructions for your appliances for advice on hardness (also sometimes referred to as "german hardness"). 
Children's Fiction:


Young Adult Fiction

The Fault In Our Stars by John Green RRP \$19.95 Reviewed by Gabbie Smith

Hazel Lancaster and Augustus Waters, two Indianapolis teenagers who meet at a Cancer Kid Support Group are the key characters in this tear-inducing epistle of a

teenage girl battling with a terminal illness, dooming her to a young death. The arrival of Augustus into Hazel's life marks the beginning of the romance chapter. The pair meet at a Cancer Kid Support Group and a friendship which blossoms into a relationship begins.

I must admit, at risk of making sound like a sad 'cancer' book, that I spent a good third of this book crying. In fact, the cancer element of the book was the least prominent source of tears for me. Whilst the silent mutation of cells is the ghost that haunts the main characters' lives, it is their attitudes towards the battle that glued the book to my side for the two days I spent devouring

it. Hazel sees herself as living on borrowed time, a ticking bomb or grenade that will, upon explosion, damage only those she draws close to herself. Augustus is also a cancer patient, but has been clear of cancer for nearly two years, his only reminder a fake leg. His only wish is to make a difference in the world or to die a martyr for a worthy cause. The pair's conflicting views on the world somehow slot them together perfectly. Their individual attitudes towards the disease that was slowly killing Hazel and that had usurped some of the finest years of Gus' life, not to mention some of his anatomy, touches your heart. Their view of the world, seen though cancer-tinted spectacles makes you reflect on the blessing that a healthy life is. They are not perfect, selfless souls, but they see the world with a clarity brought on by the knowledge you will die

soon. I found myself wishing as hard

as Hazel Grace and Augustus did that they could just have more time.

John Green excellently represents the struggles a terminal illness dictates in The Fault In Our Stars . It is without a doubt a painfully sad book, and it does not withhold the gruesome way late-stage cancers affect people. I wondered at times, that if love and pain are so synonymous, why anyone bothers to fall in love at all. But with the same dexterity exhibited in his other works, John Green provides answers for even that question, from the perspective of a dying teen that hold incredible clarity and that struck me as being incredibly tender and insightful, fitting perfectly with the rest of the novel. My copy of The Fault In Our Stars has already been well attacked with my faithful yellow highlighter and is currently making the rounds to all of my friends' reading piles. 




