

Are you fire ready?

Bushfire seasonal outlook

A recent report from the CFA has indicated that the 2013–2014 bushfire season is likely to be average to above average in much of Victoria. High flammability is expected around the Wombat Forest due to the significant underlying dryness and the residual effects of prolonged bursts of heat from last summer. If you live in a high-risk bushfire area, you are encouraged to attend your local Fire Ready Victoria meeting to find out more about current and projected conditions, and get advice on bushfire preparation and survival. Visit the CFA website at cfa.vic.gov.au to find out about a meeting happening in a town near you. If you belong to a community group or club, you can contact the CFA on 1800 735 202 to arrange a tailored fire safety session for your members.

Do you have a bushfire survival plan?

Understanding your level of risk is the first step in developing your bushfire survival plan. Research shows that many people living in high-risk areas that are threatened by bushfire will leave it too late to make critical decisions, often leaving them with very few safe options. In high-risk areas, leaving early is your safest option, particularly on Code Red, Extreme and Severe fire danger days.

You should consider:

- · Where will you go?
- · Have you packed an emergency kit?
- · What about your animals? Like people, animals can be extremely traumatised in the event of a disaster, so make sure your plan includes the welfare of your pets and livestock.

To help you to prepare your property and household in the event of an emergency call into a



Council service centre and pick up a free Community Emergency Preparation Planner.

Tips for staying safe this summer


To ensure you have a safe and enjoyable time this summer, take the time to prepare now by:

- Downloading the "Can I, Can't I" brochure from the CFA website, cfa.vic.gov.au, to find out what you can
- and can't do during the fire danger period · Preparing a bushfire survival plan
- · Attending your local Fire Ready meeting
- Downloading the CFA's Fire Ready app from the CFA website to your smartphone or tablet device and use it to stay up-to-date with local Fire Danger Ratings and Total Fire Bans

Don't forget to search for Macedon Ranges
Emergency Alerts on Facebook and "like" our page.
This Council-managed page provides tips on preparing
for and responding to an emergency in your town
or region, such as fire, flood or heatwave. It does
not replace official emergency alerts from the CFA,
Victoria Police or SES.

Remember, being fire ready is everyone's responsibility, so make sure you take the time to prepare yourself, your family, your animals and your property so that you can stay safe this summer

Vanessa's Garden

Pretty Pelargoniums for summer colour

You can't beat brightly coloured pelargoniums for adding masses of summer colour to any garden. You can pop them into border gaps or mass them in patio pots and window sills where space is limited. Trailing varieties look fabulous tumbling over walls, trellises and fences.

Geranium or pelargonium?

There's often confusion between the two because the plant that so many of us commonly call a geranium often turns out to actually be from the botanical family pelargonium. I'm not sure why they are so often misnamed, but it was certainly the case in my family. True geraniums generally sport more delicate flowers and leaves than pelargoniums.

There's a pelargonium for every garden

If you like frills and furbelows go

for 'regal' pelargoniums because they have frilled flowers and a wide variety of leaf colours and shapes.

The pelargoniums with highly patterned leaves are either the 'zonal' or 'ivy-leafed' varieties. The zonal group has been bred for leaf patterns in yellow and cream as well as green. They tend to make a compact bush and if you can keep them in a frostfree situation they can flower yearround. The ivy-leafed varieties often have a trailing habit which makes them ideal for covering fences and

Scented Pelargoniums

These beauties will give you a double hit of flowers and boldly scented foliage. Crush a leaf and you'll be delighted with scents ranging from rose, to silvery peppermint, lime, cinnamon and orange. More scented varieties are being bred all the time and for added garden interest they also display an intriguing variety of

leaf shapes from fans to curls and delicate lacy-edges.

In a frost-free location, with good drainage, scented pelargoniums can stay green all year round. My rose-scented geranium is in an open border and although it dies back every winter, it always comes back strongly around November.

Scented pelargoniums have another trick up their sleeve too. You can use the leaves to flavour stewed fruit, syrups, sauces and jellies for a noticeable but subtle hint of flavour in the finished dish.

Easy cuttings

If you've never taken cuttings before, pelargoniums are a great place to start being very easy to propagate. Cuttings are a wonderful way to multiply your plants almost for free. All you need is a few glass jars, water, some hormone rooting powder and a bit of time.

With most plants you need to

take cuttings at the right time of year and from the right place on the plant but with pelargoniums it's all very simple. Simply find a strong, healthy leaf with a good stem. Pinch it gently off the mother plant by grasping the leaf stem close to the main plant stem and bending back until it snaps off. Dip the base of the leaf stem into the hormone rooting powder and then pop it into the jar of water and place on a bright window sill. The leaf will soon start to grow roots. Keep the water fresh and your new baby pelargonium can be potted up once its roots are growing strongly. I'd suggest starting it off in seed mix and when it is growing away strongly and has made more leaves you can progressively move it into a bigger pot and standard potting compost.

Easy care

While pelargoniums are easy to look after, easy care doesn't mean no care! about where and how often they

Simple neglect is the main reason for failure with pelargoniums, even with varieties bred for sturdiness.

How to choose a healthy plant

When buying a young pelargonium at a nursery look for compact plants with healthy green leaves. They are likely to do much better than any tall, straggly-looking ones.

Where to put your pelargonium

Pelargoniums love the sun but will still get stressed when temperatures soar over 30o C and they will thank you if you can provide some midafternoon shade. Well-drained, healthy soil is ideal, so add lots of compost if you think your soil might be a bit lacking.

Water

Pelargoniums are a touch fussy

get watered and they don't wilt so you may need to keep an eye on them, and more so if they are in pots. They like to be watered well but they hate wet feet. The solution is to let the soil become touch dry between watering and although they'll tolerate rain, avoid wetting the leaves if you can when watering. Over-watering shows up as a vellowing of the leaves. Sometimes this is all over, at other times it's just a sprinkle of yellow dots across the leaves.

Food

Pelargoniums like a feed but, again, they won't let you know right away. Without food you'll see fewer and smaller flowers and, eventually, a sad yellow looking plant. You can either add a slow-release pellet to the compost/soil or use a water-soluble version around every third watering. http://www.growinggranite.com/

Gingerbread Shapes

Ingredients: 125g butter, 50g brown sugar, 3 tablespoons of golden syrup, 1 teaspoon bi-carb soda dissolved in 1 tablespoon of boiling water, 250g flour, 2 teaspoons ground ginger, pinch of salt.

Directions: Combine butter, sugar and golden syrup in a bowl and blend well until creamy.

Add bicarb soda, then the sifted, dry ingredients. Roll out between two sheets of baking paper until about 5mm thick.

Remove the top sheet of baking paper and cut into shapes as desired.

Grease the baking trays and cook for 20-30minutes at 180C. Leave on the tray to cool.

TAC funds Major Cycle Safety Campaign for Macedon Ranges

Drivers are the focus of a new summer campaign aimed at keeping cyclists in the Macedon Ranges safe. Road Safe Central Victoria and Bike Safe Macedon Ranges are set to launch a major on-road summer campaign which asks drivers to watch out for cyclists on the road and pass them with care.

This campaign is funded by a community grant from the TAC. Drivers can expect to see large billboards throughout The Ranges urging motorists to pass cyclists with care.

President of Bike Safe Macedon Ranges, Margaret Douglas explains: "This campaign is about education and awareness, commonsense and respect; it is targeted at both motorists and cyclists, they both are legitimate road users but the cyclist is more vulnerable. We want both to get home safely to their families'.

We are beholden to Road Safe Central Victoria for partnering with us in this campaign, which is a first for the Macedon Ranges, and are most grateful to the TAC for recognizing the importance of this safety initiative and for providing the

funds to make the campaign a reality in our beautiful region."

Simple messages will be promoted to motorists to allow sufficient safe space when overtaking cyclists, including driving with courtesy.

Cyclists will be reminded of their obligations to comply with relevant road rules and to ride with commonsense and courtesy towards motorists. "Waiting until it is safe before passing a cyclist takes just a few seconds out of a driver's day, those few patient seconds could save a life," Mrs Douglas said.

Lancefield-Tooborac Road to receive \$1 million boost for road safety

Amanda Millar, Member for Northern Victoria announced a \$1.047 million Victorian Coalition Government investment for road safety improvements on the Lancefield-Tooborac Road near Lancefield.

Mrs Millar said the Lancefield-Tooborac Road is an important transport and tourist route linking Melbourne and the north-central parts of the state, so ensuring the safety for all road users is very important.


This section of the Lancefield-Tooborac Road is a two lane, two way road, mostly with a 100km/h speed limit and with sections of steep hills and high speed curves.

It has a history of crashes with four serious incidents in the five year period ending November 2012, with one of these crashes resulting in a fatality.

The \$1.047 million works program will be carried out on sections of the road in the vicinity of Sherwood Court, approximately five kilometres north of Lancefield.

The safety improvement works include road shoulder widening and sealing, new guardrails, drainage works and some hazardous tree removals.

These works will improve the road safety of this



section of the road by treating the existing roadside risks to minimise 'run off road' type crashes.

It will be funded through the TAC Safer Road Infrastructure Program (SRIP), an unprecedented \$1 billion investment, an increase of more than 30 per cent a year on the previous road safety program.

An evaluation into the effectiveness of SRIP by the Monash University Accident Research Centre has identified that the program is producing a reduction of 31 per cent for all casualty crashes.

The planning and design works are expected to be completed within 8 months and works on the ground expected to begin late 2014.


Aussies visit Belgium

I accidentally met some Aussies 10 years ago taking some pictures for the Fire Brigades website and rolled into a friendship for life...

It's been several years since we heard of the plans of Bob, Pauline. Barry and Karen coming back over to Belgium, so Michiel and I made some arrangements to let them see and taste as much as possible. but considering their already long journey, it was the "light menu"...

On Tuesday August, 20th, the day was there... The train was going to arrive around 3 pm. Due to works on the tracks, Pauline and Barry had rearranged their trip from Lille Flanders to Roeselare, now they were going via Brussels... From our point of view that's traveling from Melbourne to Sydney via Alice Springs. On top of that, they missed their connection in Bruges, so it was even later, but eventually they got here.

They got a warm welcome from us and we helped them to their hotel, just in front of the railway station. When they were settled, we took them to my place for a beer and a light supper: butter room potatoes and eggs or steak, a local dish. Apparently it was a big surprise for the Aussies, they never heard of that combination.



The next day we want on a trip organised by Michiel. We first visited a military graveyard, which you find a lot in south-west Flanders. There we found the grave of the youngest soldier, died in action at the age of 14. Afterwards, we visited a war museum where we were able to go through trenches. And while we were in those trenches, the people of the museum located the spot where Bob's relative died during the Second World War. After a dinner, with local beer, in the museum's restaurant we went out searching the field where Bob's grandfather 's cousin died. We had a

moment of silence on that spot.

Later that evening we visited the ceremony at the Menin Gate, the crowd made a big impression on us all...

On Thursday the weather was typical Belgian... after the visit to the Fire Brigade, it started to rain and we went to the holy grail for our visitors: the chocolate shop. After buying almost the whole the stock, it was really raining cats and dogs so we couldn't visit the typical Belgian frites shop. Instead we went to a "less typical" frites shop where we were served very well. In the afternoon

we made a tour in the Rodenbach brewery with the 168 oak barrels, which still impresses me, and I've worked there for 3 years as student.

On Friday I had arranged a guide for a tour through Ghent. Our visitors were really surprised by all the historical buildings, speechless is actually more the word for it... They had to drink a beer to process it all. In the evening I had made reservations in a well known restaurant in Roeselare, Saint Georges, where the cook made a specialty of the region: Pork cheeks in Rodenbach with frites. We told our friends afterwards what they had eaten and they were pleasantly surprised :-)

Michiel and his wife were celebrating their wedding anniversary on Saturday and we all got together for champagne and aperitif till late afternoon. As a last surprise we came up with 2 plates with pieces of over 40 different French and Belgian cheeses. As Barry told us, he wouldn't survive here more than 2 weeks because of the heaps of food! Later that evening Michiel, Sophie, Delphie and the kids had to say goodbye, because we had to leave early to Brussels Airport.

But we made a promise to see each other again within 5 years. So I hope to be on Aussie ground one day in the near future ...

Protection . .

In the year 1930, at prepschool, I had to practice learning the alphabet. For some reason, I always got stuck at the letter "P".

Some time ago I wrote about "property". Which is a possession owned, either privately or by the general community. This time I write about protection which is a bit further down the alphabet. Property is obtained by means of effort and most people protect their property. In Lancefield this is just as much so, as in Victoria or in the whole of Australia for that matter. We protect our car and what's in it (we lock it, I hope). We fence our plot of land and lock up our houses to stop intruders. We object if authorities let others destroy our community property, whether that is our environment, our standard of living or whatever.

Nobody should use physical force against somebody else's property and defence is protection against attack. When somebody attempts to deal with with the historical wars in Persia,

somebody else's property by force, only then in defence, can we reply with force. This is a natural instinct. It happens with birds, animals and even insects (just stand on an ant's nest and

Protection is necessary for knowledge and other possessions.

In a democratic society our leaders must defend our country (landmass, airspace, mining rights, territorial waters and coastline), hence we must not just have an army, but a complete Defence Force. Our laws should protect our knowledge (with patents and trademarks), our communal finances (with taxation, rates and budget spending) and our lifestyle (cost of living, minimum wages, support for the under privileged etc.).

If defence is low or lacks sophistication, the resistance against attack usually fails. This is evident


