
Budburst Returns for 2012

Lancefield / Macedon Ranges Relay for Life

Understanding the impact of cancer on our communities

Cancer is a leading cause of disease burden in Victoria with 78 new diagnoses and 29 deaths from cancer every day. A total of 28,363 Victorians were diagnosed and 10,673 died from cancer in 2010. An estimate of the effect of a disease on the community is the "years of potential life lost" (YPLL).

This measures the loss of life due to a disease up to an arbitrary life expectancy of 75 years. In 2010, persons dying of cancer in Victoria lost an estimated 62,000 years of potential life. This is more than four times the YPLL from other major causes of death, such as ischaemic heart disease, stroke and chronic respiratory disease.

Though cancer incidence rates continue to increase (annual % increases of 0.9% for men and 0.6% for women), death rates have declined steadily since 1982 with average falls of 1.4% per year for males and 1.1% for females.

This reflects earlier detection through screening, falling tobaccorelated cancer rates for males and improvements in treatment and outcome. It is estimated that by 2013 the annual incidence of cancer will reach almost 32,000, an increase of 16% from 2010.

During the same period, deaths from cancer will increase to around 11,000 per year.

Though actual numbers of new cases and deaths are increasing rapidly, this is largely due to the growth and ageing of the Victorian population. The latest report on cancer from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare shows the five-year survival rate from all cancers increased from 47 per cent to 66 per cent from 1987 to 2010.

However the improvement was mixed for individual cancers. The cancers that had the largest survival gains over time were prostate cancer, kidney cancer and non-Hodgkin lymphoma. Over this period there was no appreciable improvement in five-year survival rates for those with mesothelioma, pancreatic cancer and lung cancer. Women recorded higher survival rates after a cancer diagnosis than men at 67 per cent, compared to 65 per cent.


Thank you to the Bendigo Bank Community Grants Program




The 5/6 students organised an Olympic competition against Lancefield Primary, with all the students having a great afternoon.

Weather Comment

The weather patterns are becoming similar to last year with a wet early Spring and now rainfall totals are reducing in both size and frequency as we progress further into the season. Paddocks, however, are in a mixed state with some dry and needing a good soaking while other parts of the farm are still too wet to safely drive on. We have measured 46mm so far and the sky is looking as though a change is possible so we shall wait and see what eventuates. The young ewes have been shorn and look very well and should present well at ewe sales in January. The cattle are also losing their Winter coat and showing improvement in their condition. The growth in the lucerne paddock has been slow but a dose of D.A.P. fertiliser this week will hopefully produce some extra growth.

The garden is looking quite a picture as the flowers come into bloom and thanks to Meryl for all her hard work to make it look so attractive. The vegie plot is also underway with snow peas, beans onions, silver beet and potatoes. A short article this month but I hope to be back in form next month.



Western Water says be fire-ready with water

Western Water is warning Lancefield residents that the town's mains water supply may be cut in the event of a fire this summer. "It's important for people to know that they need an independent water supply if they are planning to stay and defend their home," Western Water's Managing Director, Neil Brennan, says.

"If electricity is cut or our infrastructure is affected by fire, our pumps may fail, cutting the mains water supply," he says. "If we have extremely high demand for water from customers and the CFA during a fire, water pressure may also drop." Mr Brennan advises residents to consult their local CFA about their options for an independent water supply and plan ahead. "We are also doing all we can to prepare for summer, with backup generators ready and water storage tanks at high capacity to cope if we have a fire," he says. Mr Brennan says Lancefield residents can also help the community to be prepared for fire season by 'adopting' a fire hydrant. "The CFA needs to be able to access fire hydrants quickly and easily," he says. "You can help by keeping fire hydrants near your home free of debris and vegetation, and calling us if you think a hydrant needs maintenance." To find out more, visit Western Water's stall at the Bushfire and Emergency Services Expo in Riddells Creek on November 25.

Lancefield Fire Brigade

The big item of interest this month is that after years of applying the Brigade is to get a new fire station building. The current station has become too small to accommodate the increased size of the vehicles as they are constructed now.

This will mean that the Brigade will have to operate away from the current site and this will cause some alteration to how we operate while the station is built. The station we now occupy and the shed at the back will be dismantled and the new building will be set back from the road to allow tankers and other vehicles to reverse into the new station off street not as at present from the road. Inside there will be increased meeting room area and kitchen, change rooms for putting on fire fighting gear and cleaning B.A. equipment amongst other

This project is due to commence in late November or early December and may take 6 months to complete and this means we will need to do a lot of organising in a short space of time to have the site ready for the builder. Members will be advised by pager of the many

working bees needed to accomplish this task on time. Arrangements have been made with approval of Region to house the vehicles on private property. This will have an impact on turnout times but we plan that this will be minimal. As this project will be taking place during the Summer period we ask all residents to be particularly careful this Summer. We also recognise that the residents have a good record over past years in this regard.

Normal Brigade activities will happen as usual but may be at a different location from the ones we are used to. Training and skills maintenance continues as per the training calendar as a necessary part of our routine. As usual an open invitation to meet and perhaps take part in Brigade activities is extended to all interested residents.

These tasks can be as operational fire fighters or support personnel behind the scenes. We assure the residents that it will be business as usual during what will be challenging time for the Brigade .


October Book Reviews





I attended and spoke to the occupier at the address and advised them of the above offences and warned them that no only is it an offence but its an extremely thoughtless act. The reason I brought this to his attention is that it terrifies many domestic animals and can cause dogs to run off and go missing. It could also cause horses to bolt through fences seriously injuring

the animal. If this was to occur police would certainly pursue a charge of criminal damage against the responsible person. The very next day after this party I had a nearby resident attend at the police station to report that the fireworks in question had caused their dog to take off and she had very distraught child to deal with.

Please don't be thoughtless, do not purchase fireworks, or let them off as you risk committing serious offences and severe penalties.

There is a lot of good information in these packs and you can register you party with the police and we will try to attend at some stage on the night just to be sure that everything

Yes you are responsible for your guests and should make sure that you monitor those at the party to ensure they leave the party in a safe condition to get home. Be also aware that it is your responsibility to ensure underage persons at your party that consume alcohol have written permission from their parent to do so or you may commit an offence of supplying alcohol to persons underage. Most Public halls and facilities will not accept 18th Birthday Parties for very good reason. These parties are best held at home with plenty of adult supervision. MP Welcomes Crackdown On Littering

Donna Petrovich has welcomed proposed changes to legislation introduced in the Victorian Parliament this week that will see a doubling of fines for some littering offences, to act as a deterrent to litterers and help keep our streets, parks and waterways clean.

Mrs Petrovich said people caught littering would face big fines.

"Victorians have had enough of litterers, particularly in rural areas. We all have a responsibility to care for our environment and the Victorian Government makes no apology for getting tough on people rubbishing our communities and natural environments," Mrs Petrovich said.

Minister for Environment and Climate Change Ryan Smith said littering pollutes our environment, harms wildlife, wastes resources and can have serious safety implications.

"Fines are a deterrent for people who might be tempted to litter – another way to remind them of the impact of littering," said Mr Smith.

"The choice is yours - if you

don't litter you don't pay."

Amendments to the Environment Protection Act will increase fines for offences involving litter that is burning when deposited – such as a lit cigarette – to \$563 (from two penalty points to four), while the penalty for offences involving an extinguished cigarette butt or other items such as wrappers, containers, bottles or papers will rise to \$282 (one penalty point to two).

The EPA found 80 per cent of Victorians believe it is appropriate to impose fines on those who litter.

The Victorian Government is committed to encouraging practical, local action that delivers results for the environment and the community.

Already, the Government has committed to:

- \$1.5 million for landfill levy relief to help charities prevent illegal dumping at their premises.
- Roadside Litter Grants where councils and public land managers across regional Victoria and metropolitan Melbourne are eligible to apply for grants ranging from

\$25,000 to \$50,000.

- \$1 billion of waterways work over the next five years to better protect the Yarra River and Port Phillip Bay, which includes identifying litter hotspots and forming community partnerships to reduce that litter. Parks Victoria and Melbourne Water remove more than 10,000 cubic metres of litter and organic debris from 160 traps along our rivers and bay every year.
- an EPA Strike Force to target the construction, demolition and skip bin hire sectors. This will include 200 planned inspections of these types of businesses.
- \$11.5 million to retrieve more material from the municipal waste stream and recover and process more of the commercial and industrial waste, such as cardboard, metals, plastics, glass and timber, that is going to waste in our landfills.
- Get it Right on Bin Night campaign that aims to divert the equivalent of more than 300,000 wheelie bins of recyclable material that still ends up in landfill every week.

Vanessa's garden

With the growing season in full swing, and the holiday season fast approaching, two topics come to mind for this month's column. The first is wind damage. It can be very easy for young, soft plants (and older, brittle ones) to suffer nasty wind damage at this time of year, so let's look at what you can do to prevent it. The second is preparing your plants to survive if you're planning to go away on holiday.

Preventing Wind Damage

Wind damage is generally most obvious on trees, and there may be little more disheartening than seeing a carefully nurtured young tree with its leader lying on the ground, or one or more of its young branches ripped off. This type of damage never leaves a clean break either.

When it is a trunk which has been damaged, trim the area as soon as you can and ideally paste it with Bordeaux mix (moisten the powder with a little water). In my experience this is more likely to help the tree heal than attempting to tie the damage up. In fact, tying broken areas together may only serve to provide an entry point for pests and disease.

Cut broken branches back to the nearest junction (or cut off cleanly at the trunk if there is no handy junction). Try to make the final cut as straight as possible. There are differing schools of thought about the value of painting the wound. My

grandfather painted as a matter of routine, however today some say it isn't really necessary, especially as the heavy rains are likely to have finished by the time you read this. But if you have a bit of grease handy, there's no harm in a dab over the cut.

Sometimes the main indicator of wind damage isn't broken limbs but simply a very slow growth pattern due to root damage. You can often see this in native eucalypt windbreaks, where a number of 3-4 year old (and therefore larger and more expensive) nursery trees have been planted to supposedly give the shelter a head start. When these larger trees are interspersed with small tube stock, sometimes the babies catch up so quickly that you might as well not have planted the larger ones. This is because (even with staking) the older trees are more vulnerable to wind rock, which leads to root damage, whereas the younger ones have time to establish themselves securely before they get big enough for the wind to be a potential problem.

Soft-stemmed plants in the borders and veggie garden are usually best protected from wind damage with one or more stakes. It is quite important to use wood rather than metal, as the latter is an excellent conductor of heat in summer and cold in winter. These sharp temperature changes go directly down the metal to the roots, making your

plant feel ill and halting growth.

Surviving the Holidays

When you've put a lot of work into establishing a garden, selecting plants and nurturing them into a healthy display of colour and good things to eat, you'll probably be quite keen not to see all your efforts go to waste, just because the holidays happen to fall in the middle of the main growing season. On the other hand, this might be the best time of year for you to organise a holiday - so what do you do?

You might be able to set up an automated drip system on a timer. But if that's not feasible and there are no helpful family members or neighbours prepared to come round and water, the main key to helping your garden weather your absence is to deeply water before you go (particularly the most tender plants) and really pile on the mulch immediately after.

Plants which have had their first flush of flower will do much better while you are away if you are ruthless about dead-heading before the seed heads form. You can usually safely cut the plants back a bit at the same time. This will reduce their food and water needs during your absence. It will also give them a chance to rest and think about producing a second flush of flowers in a few weeks' time, in another effort to set seed.

Lancefield Bowling Club 50Th Anniversary

On Sunday 14th October 2012 the Lancefield Bowling Club held a function in their club room to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the formation of the club. In attendance were many past and current members and a great many memories were revived and much conversation was heard throughout the rooms Among the guests were Mr Murray Rowe and also the current President and Secretary and member.

Mr Stan Pattinson Mr Peter Linehan and Mrs Doreen Linehan, and Mr Robert Green who were part of a photograph of members taken in 1962 and which hangs proudly in the club room were also in attendance. The passage of time sees thes epeople as the only members still living who were in that photo and it was very pleasing that they could be part of the celebration.

Mr Gordon Charles ,the current secretary presented a history of the club and I enclose a condensed version for the interest of the community. A public meeting was convened by the local policeman at the time Mr Earnshan and chaired by the then Shire President Mr George Hall on 23rd March 1959 and 34 men and 2 women attended. The meeting agreed to form a bowling club and a committee was formed to progress the project. The next meeting was held at Lancefield Police Station on 5th June 1961 .At this meeting Mr Joe West was elected President and Mr Doug Rainey as Secretary/ Treasurer. Construction of the green began on 14th October 1961 with assistance from Mr R Linsten, Shire Engineer and on 20th June from Dr O'Lloughlin with the sowing of the grass and later rolling and mowing. The Associates were formed on 7th September 1962





and this began their long running fund raising efforts for the club which continues to this day.

The green was officially opened by Shire President Mr Ken Francis on 15th December 1962 and it was then decided to build a

club house which was officially opened on 24th October 1964 by Sir Kenneth and Lady Luke. The club house was extended in May 1989 and again in 2012 with the help of grants from Macedon Ranges Shire Council and Lancefield Community bank.

As the writer of this article I extend my thanks for the invitation to attend and the opportunity to relive old memories of the many hours spent constructing such a great bowling green, club house and club.
