Carroll Scholarships

Carroll College Scholarships

Fr. Dan Shea Scholarship

This Scholarship shall be awarded to students who meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Full-time student (12 credits)
- Demonstrates financial need and academic integrity (minimum of 2.5 cumulative GPA)
- Registered parishioner at OLV
- First-time and returning students are eligible
- How to apply: Submit a letter to the OLV parish office requesting to be considered for the scholarship and stating that the requirements of the scholarship have been met.

(Note: This is different from OLV Parish Scholarship below.)

Closing date: Must be in the OLV office by March 1, 2022.

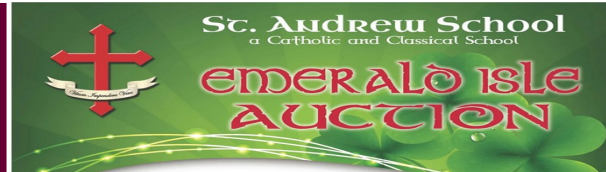

Do you know Good Samaritan Ministries and Thrift Store is so much more than a thrift store?

Ministries are an important part of what it is all about. Good Samaritan Ministries and Thrift Store is a non-profit that is local; governed by representatives of our Catholic community. Our Lady of the Valley alone contributed \$15,404 in 2021. Many other faith communities also support Good Samaritan.

The parable of the Good Samaritan goes to the very heart of the daily operations. People and local resources reaching out to our brothers and sisters in need.

Maybe it is a warm coat, rental assistance, help to pay medical expenses, vehicle repairs, or a utility bill. In the past couple years Good Samaritan has assisted in providing emergency shelter, at times housing 20 plus people night in a local motel. We strive to resolve homelessness, helping find housing and provide housing assistance. During the fiscal year ending June 2021, Good Samaritan provided over \$300,000 in financial assistance to those in need within our Helena community.

Good Samaritan also operates Our Place, a drop-in center for those struggling with mental health and addiction, providing a safe place for interaction, recovery groups, and services to help get individuals back on their feet with certified peer supports who are always there to listen and help.

At Good Samaritan each person is given dignity and respect. One-on-one personal attention is given to understand each person's journey. Peer Support is provided to seek solutions, try to help find housing, or be a conduit to help someone find and maintain employment. Good Samaritan provides guidance to services in our community to help curb hunger and seek safety from abuse or violence.

Good Samaritan is seeking employees for several available positions and has volunteer opportunities available. If you are interested in employment or volunteering, please come to the office in the Good Samaritan Store and fill out an application.

Our Newest Project:

For years Good Samaritan has patched, repaired, and used drip buckets because of issues with the Store's roof. Blessedly, we have received support from donors, foundations, and grants, but we need help to raise the \$780,000+ cost to build a new roof. We must raise an additional \$75,000 to meet our goal.
